On this week's show, Brian & Darren look at corn planting depth, potassium and lodging, corn root worm control, and the Weed of the Week, Dandelion. When planting corn you must stay within the planting depth of 1.5 to 2.5 inches depth to insure the health of the crop. If you plant the seed above the 1.5 inches roots will be exposed above the ground resulting in a weak corn stock. If the seed is planted below the 2.5 inch depth the plant doesn't have enough energy to push above ground, resulting in poor yield. One of the biggest problem for farmers is the ability to control rootworms. The eggs from last year's adult corn beetles and larva will hatch in your fields. The only way to control the rootworm is by using smart PT trait seeding or by applying pesticide to the field. Remember there's no way to recover your crop from rootworms, you must have them under control in the field before planting.

On this week's show, Brian & Darren discuss mud, soybean seed treatment, corn pre-emerge herbicides, and the Weed of the Week, Common Milkweed. When trying to determine when to get out in the field to early fertilize or start the planting process you must check the condition of the field. One test is by trying to make a mud ball. If the mud forms a compacted ball the field is too wet for your equipment to be out in it. If the mud feathers and crumples the field is ready to plant. If you plant under too wet of conditions the equipment will cause sidewall compaction resulting in trenches being made in the ground. The gapes in the ground will damage the seed and cause poor crop yields. This week's weed of the week is the common milkweed. The weed has waxy leaves so the best way to apply the Roundup and make it stick is by, using lower water volumes and higher Roundup rates and you will have much better control. In soybeans there's no good option, there might be something to burn down the milkweed like cobra or flex-star treatments.

On this week's show, Brian & Darren look at spray timing, in-furrow soybean fertilizer, planting populations, and the Weed of the Week, Marestalk. On Farm basic the discussion is about the big challenge of weeds having to be actively growing in order for herbicides to kill the weeds. In order for the herbicide to be absorbed in the plant the plant needs to be actively growing. Make sure to follow the directions on the herbicide product for application and spraying condition. The weed of the week is Marstalk, the best way to control this weed is to apply Banvel in the fall of the year to prevent the weed from becoming a problem.

On this week's show, Brian & Darren look at carbon to nitrogen ratio, spring burn down, three pre approach, and the Weed of the Week, Johnsongrass. The problem about spring is all the weeds to control before planting. This week's Farm basic talks about the Carbon to Nitrogen ratio. If the Carbon to nitrogen ratio is too high, the perfect number is a little debatable 16:1, and the farm goes out and sprays nitrogen thinking this will be good for the corn or wheat crop the nitrogen will not be able to

penetrate into the soil and the application will be of no benefit in the short run. The nitrogen gets tied up in the residue until the level gets down below 16:1. Because of the heavy residue of the corn stalk farmers have to apply more nitrogen each year in order for the nitrogen to penetrate into the soil to become food for the plants.

The Russian Ambassador to the U.S. Sergey Kislyak was on the program to discuss the crisis in Ukraine following a fatal shootout at a checkpoint manned by pro-Russia insurgents in eastern Ukraine. Kislyak made his remark as thousands of Russian troops occupy eastern Ukraine and several weeks after Russian President Vladimir Putin annexed Crimea, the eastern peninsula of Ukraine.

According to Congressman Xavier Becerra, The Republican conference is so fractured, there's only two things they agree on, they don't like ObamaCare and so, we've had 50 votes on that and they do like talking about Benghazi. So, we've had four investigations on that. Chris Wallace asks: Senator Ayotte, why she thinks CIA, the State Department and the White House ignored their people and the ground when they said this was not a terror attack? She responded by saying it was a way for the pushing a political explanation leading up to an election. The president had been saying al Qaeda was on the run. They were trying to push a narrative of strength in foreign policy. This did not fit their narrative. This is actually a broader failure of foreign policy, the light footprint policy.
