He interviews Dr. Peter Marks in FDA research and discusses how flu vaccine will prevent exposure and hospitalization especially for COVID risk. It is possible to have both viruses. Flu vaccine can reduce the risk of COVID. FluB can cause more serious disease in children. Quadrivalent vaccines are best and contain four inactivated virus strains and an adjuvant that helps immunity. Each February FDA, WHO, and CDC get together to determine which flu variants are more common and will be decided by the FDA to make the next years vaccine.
