Minimum: Two (2) Public Service Announcements per hour between 12:00 Midnight and 6:00 AM
 One (1) Public Service Announcement per hour between 6:00 AM and 12:00 Midnight

Exceptions to this policy occur during public affairs programming and during special event broadcasts such as live sporting events, concerts simulcast, etc.
