World History Profile Mental health	<b>After Auschwitz</b>	12/10 @10pm	60 min	Six Jewish women who survived the Holocaust - Eva Beckmann, Erika Jacoby, Rena Drexler, Lili Majzner, Renee Firestone and Linda Sherman - tell their extraordinary life stories. When Auschwitz was liberated in January 1945, it was the beginning of a lifelong struggle for these survivors. The film recounts how the six women have built their lives since the war - getting married, immigrating to America, building careers, and raising children and grandchildren - while looking for a way to understand their trauma and loss.
Public Affairs Politics Profile	<b>After Parkland: Healing a Community and a Nation</b>	12/06 @10pm	60 mins	On February 14, 2018, a shooter took 17 lives at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida. The film shows how Parkland has turned its grief into healing and meaningful action toward ending gun violence, following the 25-city #NeverAgain summer bus tour. The documentary also features positive change made closer to home, including an anthem honoring Stoneman-Douglas students by Melissa Manchester and the Douglas choir.
American History Civil Rights Culture Politics Profile	<b>Rising from the Rails: The Story of the Pullman Porters</b>	12/10 @9pm	60 min	Explore the little-known history of the African American men hired to work on railroad sleeping cars beginning in the late 1860s. Serving wealthy, white passengers in the golden age of rail travel, the Pullman Porters carried labor organizing skills, civil rights ideals, and elements of black culture - such as jazz and blues - across the country. As trailblazers in the struggle for African American self-sufficiency, the Pullman Porters inspired future generations of independent black leaders, including their own future descendants.
Mental Health Profile	<b>Speaking Grief</b>	10/31 11pm	60 mins	Explore why the pain of losing a loved one can be so difficult to understand and discuss. The film interviews grieving families from across the U.S., whose losses range from stillbirth to suicide, to address

				common misconceptions about grief. The film also presents ideas for how family and friends can better support each other through loss.

In rural parts of Virginia, one-third of residents lack access to high-speed Internet. Without it, individuals are excluded from opportunities in business, education, health care and more. Major carriers can't make it cost-effective to serve low-density areas, and government funding for broadband infrastructure has been minimal.
