KS cold case solved	Oct. 4, 2023	7 a.m.	:47

KSMO reports police in Wichita believe they have solved a 34-year-old cold case. Investigators in Kansas are now naming Paul Hart as the suspect in the case that saw 20-year-old Krista Martin be sexually assaulted and murdered in 1989. The case was cracked by recent advances in DNA technology, which authorities said was not available three decades ago.

KCK police presence Oct. 24, 2023 7 a.m. 4:15

KSMO reports Kansas city, Kansas, Police say there is no threat to the public after a large police presence was requested in the area of 6th Street and Orville Avenue in KCK. That's the Strawberry Hill neighborhood and fairly close to KCK City Hall.

KSMO reporter Joe Hennessy was live at the Oak Park Mall following up on previous reporting about a shooting that happened Sunday afternoon. KSMO reports the shooting happened in the mall's food court. It happened just two days after another shooting at the Independence Center Mall.

Gladstone stolen car arrest Nov. 24, 2023 7 a.m. :42

KSMO anchor Julia Avery reports Eduardo Dominguez-Garcia was arrested after being on the run for three years. Investigators in Gladstone said he killed his girlfriend three years ago and was caught Nov. 23, 2023, after police used new "Flock" technology to discover the car he was driving was stolen. Dominguez-Garcia had already been charged and a judge in Chippewa County said they would extradite him back to face those charges.

KSMO anchor Bill Hurrelbrink reports Kansas City, Missouri Police are searching for the driver responsible for stealing a car and then killing someone with it. The hit-and-run crash happened just east of 71 Highway at 31st and Agnes. The driver was speeding in the opposite lanes of traffic in a Hyundai Sonata, KCPD said.

Homicide record tracker Dec. 28, 2023 7 a.m. :58

After a pregnant woman was killed in KCMO, KSMO reports on the record homicide pace the city is on. The woman's death was the 179th life lost to violent crime in 2023 in Kansas City, Missouri. It ties the record for Kansas City's deadliest year ever. A medical examiner told KSMO once they are able to confirm the woman's pregnancy that would mark the 180th homicide, setting the record for the deadliest year in the city's history.

Troubles brewed at the Truman Sports Complex Sunday night as some of the major interstates backed up due to traffic associated with the Beyonce concert. Her show didn't begin until at least 10 p.m., hours after she was originally supposed to be starting her performance. The Royals had a game wrapping up at roughly the same time as the gates opened for the concert.

Mack Trucks strike Oct. 9, 2023 7 a.m. :27

The United Auto Workers strike is expanding, KSMO reports. Anchor Julia Avery says the strike is going further after workers at Mack Trucks were set to begin picketing on Monday morning. The expanded strike comes after UAW president Shawn Fain says 73 percent of workers voted against the deal, which included a 19-percent pay raise. KSMO reports Mack Trucks' parent company, Volvo, says it is committed to finding an agreement.

The bill requires agencies to place trans kids with parents who promote the gender identity, but Andrew Bailey says it's unconditional. Bailey argues the Supreme Court has rejected attempts to exclude parents based on religious beliefs.
