Work has temporarily halted as they test a new self-consolidating concrete on the ceiling. Meanwhile, the Department of Transportation and contractors are responding to neighbor concerns about trash, including a discarded T-V, in the pedestrian walkway. And a DOT spokesman says additional fencing was installed to discourage homeless people from sleeping and defecating in the tunnel. The repairs were initially supposed to be finished by the end of last year at an estimated cost of 3 point 5 million dollars.</p>

The local organization Advocates for Autism partnered with the Ross Park Zoo to provide free admission to kids with autism that were accompanied by one paying adult. President Sally Colletti helped to found the local group when her son, who is on the spectrum, was still a toddler. Now that he's an adult, her focus has shifted to the needs of adults with autism who often still rely heavily on their parents. Colletti says it's past time to move from awareness and acceptance to appreciation. Colletti says her group would like to see zoning changes so that so-called granny pods, or separate small housing for adult children with autism, can be built on their parents' property in residential neighborhoods. She'd like to see other appropriate, integrated housing options for autistic adults. Dutchess County Executive Marc Molinaro, who is the Republican candidate for New York's 19th Congressional District this November, visited the event. He has a daughter with autism and founded the organization ThinkDifferently which advocates for people with special needs.</p>

NYSEG released a statement today saying the company anticipates restoring service to 95 percent of the affected customers by 11:30 p.m. tomorrow. Approximately 22,900 customers are without power between Broome, Chenango, and Tioga counties. The storm caused more than 11 hundred downed wires between the three counties, and 90 broken utility poles. Despite a national dry ice shortage, distribution continued today Vestal Supervisor John Schaffer says roughly 250 vehicles came to collect dry ice and water at a distribution site set up in the town.

Interviews with her father and brother, canvassing of the neighborhood and the review of private home security cameras have yet to turn up a solid lead in the case. After initially setting a reward amount of 10 thousand dollars for help in finding the perpetrator, members of the community have pledged additional funding, bringing the reward up to 19 thousand, 500 dollars.</p>

The Food Bank has announced an effort to create more School Food Centers across its 6-county region. The concept moves beyond the traditional pantry model with the addition of equipment and storage that allows students to learn about food preparation as well as participate in the distribution of food. The BOCES East Learning Center located inside the Columbus School in Binghamton opened the region's first School Food Center in 2018. The center develops rotating menu items and needy families can request up to 9 meals to take home each month. The Food Bank has received a 75-thousand-dollar state grant secured by Assemblywoman Donna Lupardo that will be made available to school districts in Binghamton, Vestal and the Town of Union to purchase equipment needed to set-up their own food centers. Broome County then stepped in with another 100 grand to outfit other districts in the county, plus 25 thousand toward inventory.</p>

Cathi sometimes endures PTSD-induced dreams. Cathi's idea for the device was to build a light that her service dog could operate when she was having these nightmares. Brion Byfield was the finance and logistics manager for the project and says it's really satisfying to take someone's ideas and turn them into reality. The light can change colors, fade in and out, and has adjustable brightness levels. The students listened to Cathi's recommendations and sent her several prototypes before the final version. Roe granted the federal and constitutional right to abortion; however, after today's decision, states now have the authority to determine if and when an abortion is legal. The Founding Director of Southern Tier Women's Health Services, Peg Johnston says that this is a sad day for democracy. Johnston says in a statement released by the clinic, that this decision will disproportionately impact women of lower socioeconomic status and women of color. She says many women will now face challenges related to travel, childcare, and costs of proper abortion treatment. However, the clinic was also celebrating New York State for its passionate support of abortion rights. Today, alone, Southern Tier Women's Health Services has received over 22 thousand dollars in donations. Johnston says that the clinic is prepared to cater to the potential increase of clients traveling for an abortion. She says that in the past, the clinic has taken clients as far as Texas.</p>

At approximately 9:45 a.m. the defendant was driving a tractor trailer when his vehicle struck the left side of Howe's truck. A piece of metal from the tractor trailer severely injured Howe. Five days later, Howe passed away. The defendant was found guilty, and sentenced to 21 days of incarceration, 5 years of probation and 250 hours of community service. The defendant appealed, arguing that the verdict is not supported by sufficient evidence. The Court of Appeals states that it is true that the defendant did not slow down and did not change lanes; however, if the defendant failed to see the victim's vehicle, then he would not have been aware of the necessity to slow down and move left. As a result, the evidence acknowledges the defendant's failure to see Howe's truck on the shoulder, and although the failure resulted in a tragic death, the circumstances do not constitute a criminally negligent homicide. Because the evidence was insufficient to sustain the defendant's conviction, the judgment was reversed, and the indictment dismissed.
