Currently the Coast Guard is conducting rescue operations for individuals who fled the fire by heading into the ocean. So far fourteen people have been saved. There have however been multiple casualties due to the fire. Twenty people are being treated for injuries at various hospitals, some of whom are in critical condition. At this time, Nine-One-One is not available in West Maui. For those in the affected area, you should call the La-Hai-Na Police Department if you need emergency help That number is Eight-Oh-EightSix-Six-OneFour-Four-Four-One Once again the number is Eight-Oh-EightSix-Six-OneFour-Four-One That will put you in touch with the La-Hai-Na police department if you need emergency help in West Maui. Emergency shelters can be found at the Maui Preparatory Academy in Na-Peeli and the Maui High School in Ka-Hulias well as the War Memorial Center and the Hannibal Tavares Community Center in Puka-Lani. For those trying to find their friends or family affected by the wildfires, you can visit red-cross-dot-org and go to contact loved ones. Depending on where you are, cellphone service is currently out, and will be restored as soon as it can be. President Biden has tasked the Department of Defense with assisting how they can with getting the wildfires under control and saving lives. Containment on all those reached 50-100% yesterday evening. An unsafe water alert is in effect for Upper Kula and Lahaina so use bottled water in those areas. Access to Lahaina is going to remain restricted today to those with residential ID. In addition to Red Cross, a Family Assistance Center for those of us looking for loved ones will open at 10am this weekend at the Kahului Community Center. Food, Water, toiletries, canned goods, baby formula, diapers, clothing and pet food will be distributed from 10 to 4 today at Lahaina Gateway Center. Yesterday almost 1,500 people were at emergency shelters: War Memorial Gymnasium, Hannibal Tavares Community Center, Maui High School, The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints Maui Lani, Kings Cathedral Church and Grace Bible Church. The Department of Transportation is coordinating buses to take those people to the DMV today from 8am to 12:30pm so those evacuees can have their ID and driver's licenses reissued, all fees will be waved. Some cell service has been restored to West Maui, officials say to text rather than call to ration limited service. We are praying for everyone affected by these fires and for the first responders.

Erik Naylor, a pastor and dad, heard some noises and went outside to tidy up things that were blowing around. The unexpected strong wind was coming from Hurricane Dora, which was passing to the south of Hawaii. As morning came, the Naylor family was looking out their window at their neighbors' homes "and the roofs from the houses are just slowly peeling off from the wind. Shingles are like flying!" They'd never seen anything like that. "It was a normal day, besides like the crazy winds." Erik's wife, Danni, had invited some moms over to study a book about parenting. And Erik, "I'm like watching a dozen kids" as the women gathered. Pretty much a normal day, for a while. But around midday, the Naylors got word about a fire a few miles away – and saw the smoke in the distance, "and slowly the smoke got bigger." But by now, the power was out, and then cell phones went offline. The family couldn't receive any updates on the fire situation "and the smoke just slowly creeped close and closer and closer." By late afternoon the flames were visible and the family of seven opted to leave, even though they weren't aware of any formal evacuation order. It just made sense to go. "We completely thought we were coming back to our home in a couple of days," explained Erik. "Little did we know as we were just leaving our home in the afternoon, the entire main stretch of the town (Lahaina) was just completely being burned down." Cars were exploding. It was like a war zone. And that same fate would come a few hours later to the Naylor home. By now, you've no doubt heard about the more than 100 lost lives, the many still unaccounted for, the massive

Pastor Erik, who is in the process of launching a new church (still unnamed) in Lahaina, shares that they had planned to start meeting as a church team on what turned out to be the day after the fire. But everyone was now scattered across Maui. And the same day had been set for the Naylor Family's first day of school for the girls. But the school was lost. All the plans were literally up in smoke. So much was now in flux. For the first days after the fire, Pastor Erik traveled to check on friends and church members, and bring them safe water and food. No one was entirely sure if friends and family were even still alive. God kept his hand on the Naylors. "People are figuring out where they're going to live. Ourselves, we - by God's grace - we have a place right now, we have a place for the next month, and we're trusting four or five weeks from now, that the Lord is going to provide again for us with permanent housing. All of our church members are in similar situations. Where are they going to live? What is their work going to look like?" As for his church 'planting' mission, "A lot of the practical things are going to look very different. But the things I was convicted about, when we came out here, what we were going to do, we'll continue to do - which is, we're going to be a church focused on God's Word, teaching small groups, one-on-one discipleship, individually, completely engrossed in God's Word." Pastor Erik intends to love on the people of Maui.
