Focus: WPAQ/WSYD teamed up with the Surry County Office of Substance Abuse to air a variety of thirty second messages highlighting the dangers of vaping, alcohol, fentanyl, etc. A tiny amount can cause a fatal overdose. Alcohol and Drug use is on the rise in our coverage area. Actual Surry County Schools students voiced these announcements. WPAQ/WSYD simulcast a 27 minute interview with Charlotte Reeves on prevention, intervention, treatment and recovery. The interview told of ways that are being done to reach and keep students from using drugs.

Program: "Dangers of texting & Driving" Especially among our areas teens

Program Length: 15 minutes

Focus: WPAQ/WSYD Simulcast a 15 minute interview to help teens especially know the dangers of texting while driving. It's illegal in NC to operate a motor vehicle with your eyes distracted by cell phones. Statistics show that serious and even fatal accidents among teens are on the rise in Surry County. One of the highlights of the interview was telling of an upcoming teen texting and driving trauma simulation/mock scenario on parking lots. In the interview Kelly & Tina told how this event was organized by Northern Regional Hospitals Camp-Med students interested in healthcare. One out of every four car accidents is caused by texting and driving. 21% of teen drivers involved in fatal car accidents are distracted by their cell phones.

Program: "Damaging Buried Utility Lines by Digging"

Focus: WPAQ/WSYD ran thirty second PSA's reminding our listeners to call 811 before digging. Locally statistics show an increase in the number of Surry County residents who have been damaging buried utility lines by digging. Excavators have not been calling 811 or waiting until the utilities have been marked before digging. Surry Communications provided the script that was read hourly during the entire month of August.

Program: "Coping with Alzheimer's & Walk to end Alzheimer's"

Guests: CEO Alzheimer's Association Western Carolina Chapter Katherine Lambert VP of Communications, Alzheimer's Association Western Carolina Chapter Christine John-Fuller Focus: WPAQ/WSYD ran thirty second ads reminding our listeners to form teams and come out and walk to end Alzheimer's on Saturday September 9, 2023 along with how to raise funds and awareness. WPAQ/WSYD broadcast from the event at Riverside Park interviewing loved ones who have family coping with Alzheimer's along with airing the promise garden ceremony. On 8-8-23 Kelly Epperson interviewed CEO Katherine Lambert that covered all the details for participation in the walk in Mount Airy. A goal of \$75,000 was set for this year with funds coming primarily from the walk. Since Alzheimer's disease is on the rise in our area the latest research & breakthroughs were discussed as well as giving information on early diagnosis and help and support hotline for those caregivers.

The Surry County United Fund serves to strengthen and serve our community by helping meet the needs of our neighbors working with agencies to find solutions for crisis, senior medical and family and youth. These agencies like American Red Cross, the Shepherd's House and the Salvation Army directly serve residents of Surry County. There are 26 agencies in all. We must help the SUF to reach its goal for 2023-24 of \$550,000. The Annual rocks & Runs event is a major contributor to reach the goal. The listener's learned about Your Father's House and how they can offer support both financially and spiritually as this is a Christian based recovery house. Affected men on their way to recovery stay generally 6 months. Listeners were guided to a website for greater awareness yourfathershouse.org. The facility is in dire need of funding and greater awareness in order to continue serving.
