Senior adult issues – Seniors in the area are currently faced with a difficult time locating housing, WLIL helps listeners connect with cheap affordable housing providers and other community outreach programs.

Agriculture – WLIL features a weekly agriculture report Saturday mornings by working with the University of Tennessee Extension Service, with topics ranging from many topics such as tending crops and animal husbandry.

Opioids, Drugs, and Alcohol – WLIL receives information from local government and makes announcements about the ways that addicts may receive help in various ways. WLIL also broadcasts information concerning the drug problem in the community and surrounding areas.

Literacy – WLIL provides listeners with the help they need to learn how to read. Information is provided by support groups such as the local library and broadcast to the community.

Worker Shortage – WLIL helps job seekers connect with employers who may hire them into positions within the community.

Homelessness – WLIL provides homeless with information for outreach groups that may help them find temporary or permanent housing within the community so that they may get back on their feet and re-enter society.
