Neither violence nor politics can fix social injustice. After 40 years in exile, and after meeting God, Moses second response was redemption. He took the Word of God to Pharaoh

Lacking confidence, but wanting acceptance, Keith started using drugs early in high school, eventually becoming addicted to PCP by his Junior year and landing in jail a rehab program after a violent outburst in the principal's office. His self-hate led him to become hateful and morbid. Three near-death experiences did not shake him out of his drug habit, but he did hold down 3 jobs at once just to keep his mind busy. He was invited to church in 1980, and liked knowing that "Bible characters" just regular people like himself who were loved, changed, and used by God. It took three more years and a very bad drug "trip" to get him back to church and into a Bible before he realized his need for a Savior from his sin. He was saved in 1983 and found the help and hope he needed in Jesus. He went on to minister to addicts of all kinds, hoping to make a

He was about to join the US Olympic boxing team when he was disciplined for fighting and drinking and lost that chance. After starting a boxing program on base and then being forced to stop it, he became disillusioned and left base unauthorized to go to Mexico and stay high for days. He was kicked out
