							decision the yearly rate of abortions has increased over 100 times the rate prior to that decision. Today in the USA, 1.6 million abortions are performed yearly, and over 4,300 per day. Of those abortions, over 70% are performed on unwed mothers. One quarter of all abortions in the USA end in abortion. Christians should be aware that the Bible condemns abortion as murder and teaches that God is in control of conception and birth and that he sees each unborn baby as an individual for whom he cares and for whom he has a perfect will. With all of that in mind, Christian women should not be neutral about abortion but should decide well in advance of a pregnancy that she will honor God by choosing to keep the gift of the child that he has given. Christians should stand against abortion, familiarize themselves with the types and results of abortions such as suction, burning, and suffocating so that they may speak intelligently on the matter. They can support the Hatch amendment to the Constitution, teach their children God's view of life and abortion, and support and exemplify a lifestyle of wholesome activity.

Fugate pointed out the devastating consequences that we have seen and may yet see because of the failed Afghanistan pull-out, the destruction of the last hurricane in the south, the China virus, rioting in our cities, and more. Listeners were exhorted by Fugate to avoid blaming this or that policy or politician, and instead to realize that these calamities are not coincidental but are sent by God to awaken His believers. Instead of blaming others, Fugate believes Christians must recognize that the help of our nation has always come from God when his people look to him and live for him. In that light, Christians should turn from sin, live holy, and share the gospel.

Quoting the writings of early justices and public servants (including the verdict of from Feb 29, 1892 in the supreme court case of The Holy Trinity vs the United States), as well quoting the Declaration itself, Fugate made his points; among which are the following examples. Our founders believed that natural law is the basis for our system of government; that faith in God secures freedom; that all men are created equal (a direct contrast to the CRT being taught in public schools now); our rights are God-given not government-given and are to be protected by the government); and that God is the protector of life. Fugate encouraged individuals and families to educate themselves on our founding documents and on the Bible. Listeners were also encouraged to pray for and to choose virtuous leaders. He further admonished listeners to live righteously
