Her third abortion took a surprising turn when, two weeks after it, her uterus was still enlarged. A sonogram reveal a second baby who had been a twin. Viewing the sonogram changed Cynthia's mind about her baby when she saw him moving quickly in her womb. Cynthia married and had three more children with her husband; started helping at a pregnancy

Rita was molested at age 4; by age of 6, she was a petty thief, and by the age of 11, she was dating older men and drinking alcohol. She ran away from home at the age of 13 and married a man so violent that she attempted suicide several times in an effort to escape him. Rita fell pregnant at the age of 18 by this violent husband, but the state took her baby for safety. In an effort to pursue a custody battle for her baby, Rita became a prostitute in Chicago; but, although she put herself at great risk, she never did get her daughter back. A dirty needle gave Rita serum hepatitis and her lifestyle made her sick enough that a doctor told her to stay off of her feet and stay clean; but she did neither of those things. After stealing farm implements with a boyfriend, Rita was jailed shortly but a technicality got her out. Back at home with her mother, Rita continued to party until an old friend from high school named Manuel began to
