It put a 10 pm "Last Call" on alcohol sales at bars and restaurants. But a state-wide mandate is still in place that began in July. The restriction was meant to help stop the spread of covid-19. And the city health commissioner says the cases are dropping . So, for now she says the city restrictions aren't needed. But the statewide last call of ten at night is still in place. Business owners sued both the city and state over this. And they continue to argue it's really hurting their sales. Keep in mind, council could bring back its restrictions, depending on how the virus is spreading. Meanwhile, the statewide restrictions are set to last through November.

The real concern over road congestion is focused around this piece of land, the 104 acre property-- next to the Bo Jackson Elite Sports development on Cosgray Road the city is considering selling to Amazon who is looking to build a data center. The city council entertained community input during their July 13th meeting and there were many, many comments from the community, not even one in favor of the change in zoning to allow a data center. Yet the elected council, which is supposed to represent the people, voted unanimously to go forward with the proposed zoning change.

Mayor Ginther says this is the kind of change people are calling for, the fop wants to make sure the process is fair. FOP President Keith Ferrell says they have a contract team ready to begin negotiations this month. Ferrell says the two biggest priorities are the public's safety and that officers are treated fairly.

					<p>violent protests in Columbus and across the state. It was this past spring, outside the statehouse, when the situation got out of control. This was just one example. Some businesses in downtown Columbus are still boarded up. Others have put plywood back-up because of concerns about possible protests following the election. Two state reps have introduced what they call the "Law and Order Act". Representative Sara Carruthers called it common sense, "Vandalism, looting, and violence are not free speech. frankly, these types of reckless and irresponsible actions typically from a handful of agitators, detract from the core message of law abiding demonstrators are trying to convey." The bill is new it hasn't been put into a committee yet. But here's what we do know. It creates a new riot assault charge if someone recklessly causes physical harm. Also, it increases the punishment for vandalism and blocking roads. Finally, it allows injured police officers to file a civil lawsuit against those responsible, including riot organizers. The bill has more than a half-dozen co-sponsors. They're all republicans.</p>
