CAROLINA CARES (ISSUES PROGRAM) 7:00AM – 7:30AM

Alzheimer's Association of South Carolina – Duration: 29 min

ISSUE: Alzheimers

This week on Carolina Cares, Tyler Ryan speaks with Taylor Wilson with the Alzheimer's Association of South Carolina about research that may be linking behaviors and injuries to the disease, understanding the signs, resources that are available to those living with it, and the friends and families who become caregivers. The two also discuss this year's Walk to End Alzheimer's. October 4.

DHEC Public Health – Duration: 29 min

ISSUE: Covid19/Corona Virus

This week on Carolina Cares, Tyler Ryan speaks DHEC Public Health Physician Dr. Jonathan Knoche about the latest information on Covid 19, the DHEC best guidance, various treatments, what is on the horizon, the CDC's shifts in numbers, prevention etc., as well as the impact that this years flu may have on it. October 11. .

Humane Society of South Carolina – Duration: 29 min

ISSUE: Pet Care

This Week on Carolina Cares, Tyler Ryan speaks with Dawn Wilkinson, Executive Director of The Humane Society of South Carolina. The two discuss the importance of having pets spayed and neutered, as well as the overpopulation problem and programs that are offered to law enforcement around the state, free of charge. October 18.

South Carolina Treasurer Curtis Loftis – Duration: 29 min

ISSUE: Economic Impact of Covid19

This week on Carolina Cares, Tyler Ryan sits down with South Carolina Treasurer Curtis Loftis to discuss the impacts of Covid 19 on the state budget, spending, and the bigger impact of governmental

programs. They also discuss Operation Check Reduction, which has saved South Carolina \$20 million by cutting the number of paper checks that are issued to employees, as well as the Future Scholar program, and how it has changed. October 25.

Children's Cancer Partners of the Carolinas – Duration: 29 min

ISSUE: Children's Health/Cancer

This week on Carolina Cares, Tyler Ryan speaks with the leadership team of Children's Cancer Partners of the Carolinas, a non-profit organization that works directly with the families of children who have been diagnosed with cancer, to help facilitate transportation to the various specialty hospitals across the Country, as well as organize group events, camps, and other programs for the families. The group also talks about their upcoming virtual cooking event, which will be broadcast live from The Kennedy restaurant in Spartanburg, SC. November 1.

Warrior Pathh – Duration: 29 min

ISSUE: PTSD

This week on Carolina Cares, Tyler Ryan speaks with the Founder of The Big Red Barn Retreat Sutton Shaw, and US Army Command Sergeant Major (ret) Lemont Christian about the Warrior Pathh, an innovative intense program for Veterans and First Responders fighting the effects of PTSD related to their service to the County and Community. The Big Red Barn, located in Blythewood, SC has offered equine therapy, yoga, and many other programs geared toward coping with the affliction. The Warrior Pathh program is one of eight in the Country, offering a 7 day in-house program designed to educate and more importantly, listen to the day to day combat our heroes endure AFTER their service. November 8.

ISSUE: Homelessness

Eagle Cold Case and Missing Person Institute – Duration: 29 min

ISSUE: Crime

This week on Carolina Cares, Tyler Ryan interviews James Carsten, the Found of the Eagle Cold Case and Missing Person Institute about the growing number of unsolved homicides and missing persons cases in America. The two discuss what Carsten feels is behind some of the issue, as well as the Foundation he started that works directly with citizens groups to understand how to “reverse engineer” criminal investigations, giving a fresh set of trained eyes, and partnering with law enforcement in hopes of reducing some of the 211,000 cold homicides on record since 1980 (Rand institute numbers). December 6.

Salvation Army – Duration: 29 min

ISSUE: Charity

This week on Carolina Cares with Tyler Ryan, we visit with Major Henry Morris with the Salvation Army. The two discuss the mission of the Salvation Army, the impact of volunteerism, and of course the Red Kettle Campaign, and what every dollar donation means. Tyler also talks with The Executive Director of the Columbia City Ballet, William Starrett about the annual Nutcracker performances, and how the story changes with every year, keeping the timeless story fresh. December 13.

South Carolina Department of Motor Vehicles – Duration: 29 min
