Alzheimer's Association - Duration: 29 min

ISSUE: Alzheimer's research

This week on Carolina Cares, Tyler Ryan speaks with Taylor Wilson from the Alzheimer's Association about some of the big wins in 2019, and what some of the goals are for 2020 in research and understanding of this affliction that impacts over 90,000 South Carolinian's.
