***** Kavontae Smalls reported that 60-year-old Roy Middleton is still recovering after having been shot by Escambia Sheriff Deputies while in his own driveway, looking for cigarettes in his car. A neighbor had called in a report of suspicious activity, and the Deputies claim Middleton was non-compliant, leading them to open fire, shooting him 15 times thinking he was a car thief. Sheriff David Morgan believes the reason the case has attracted national attention has less to do with the shooting, and more about race ... Middleton is black, the two officers are white. The family wants the Deputies to be held accountable. County Commissioners are also looking into the case.

***** A 150-year-old magazine, the Atlantic, lists seven agencies in Florida as most violent, putting the Escambia County Sheriff's office at number one, citing last month's shooting of Roy Middleton and the Sheriff's reaction to the case. Morgan defended his agency's record, saying they've responded to 1.3 million calls for service over the last 4 years, with only 24 of those alleging racial profiling, and all of those cases cleared by the Department of Justice. Crestview came in third on the list, and the new Police Chief there has instituted a system for investigating formal complaints.

***** "1963" presented a behind-the-scenes look at the Birmingham movement (there had been over 60 bombings of black churches and homes by the time Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. signed on) and included the footage that first grabbed America's attention - the fire hoses and guard dogs, etc. A major focus of the program was the Rev. Fred Shuttlesworth, a minister in Birmingham, whose church was bombed three times before the SCLC came. The protests there were ultimately a huge victory in the Civil Rights movement, the first in fact for Dr. King. The city was largely integrated by the time he left and went on to the March on Washington and the "I Have a Dream" speech.
