Today's issue was: "Should illegal immigrants be eligible for driver's licenses?" California last week became the latest and biggest state to authorize driver's licenses for illegal immigrants. But most U.S. voters still strongly oppose the idea. Immigrant advocates have long lobbied for the change so immigrants in the country illegally can drive without fear of being pulled over for a ticket, which could get them deported. Supporters also believe that the roads will be safer by getting immigrants properly trained and tested so they know how to drive and know traffic rules. The licenses would carry a distinction on the front of the card that states the document may be used for driving, but not as federal identification. The licenses are expected to be issued starting in 2015. But sixty-eight percent (68%) of likely voters think illegal immigrants should not be eligible for driver's licenses in their state. A new Rasmussen Reports national telephone survey finds that just 22% favor it.

\*\*\*\*\* Today's issue was: "Do you believe a third major political party is needed?" The public frustration over the frequent stalemates in Washington has produced some of the lowest approval ratings for Congress in history. And that frustration is now taking aim at the two-party system, not just the politicians themselves. A new Gallup poll finds that 60-percent of Americans say the Democratic and Republican parties do such a poor job in representing the American people, that a third major party is needed. That's the highest number that Gallup has measured in the ten years they've been asking that question. Just 26-percent say the two parties do an adequate job. 14-percent say they aren't sure. And the findings are consistent across party lines. Of the people who believe a third party is needed, 51 percent are Republicans, and 49 percent are Democrats.

\*17 Our Washington reporter Kristine Frazao interviewed Jack Abramoff, a former Washington lobbyist convicted of tax evasion, and now a very outspoken critic of the lobby system, which he says undermines democracy. He says the people who have impact on legislation, and sometimes actually write legislation, are not elected officials but rather lobbyists paid by special interests. Many lobbyists are appointed as top administration officials, for both parties, and many former congressmen become lobbyists. Abramoff said the system has changed to make it more "polite looking", but no substantive changes have occurred in the last 40 years.

\*18 Today's issue was: "If the election were held today, would you vote for Charlie Crist or Rick Scott to be the next Governor of Florida?" It may end up being the marquee gubernatorial battle of 2014. And a poll out this week shows that if the election were held today between Florida Governor Rick Scott, and former Governor Charlie Crist... Crist would have the edge. According to a Quinnipiac University survey released Thursday, 47% of Sunshine State voters now support Crist, while 40-percent say they'd vote for Scott. But Crist's seven percentage point advantage is down from a 10-point lead in June ... and a 16-point lead in March. Last month Crist, who served four years as a Republican Governor, announced his democratic challenge to Scott. In March of 2009, Crist announced he would run for an open U.S. Senate seat in 2010 rather than for a second term as governor. That seat was ultimately won by Marco Rubio. (page 5)

We interviewed Congressman Andy Harris (R-MD) who has introduced a bill to change that, forcing PACs to disclose details of all their expenditures. So far, his bill has only two co-sponsors, but Harris vows to keep pushing for passage.
