***** We aired a live report from the U.S. Supreme Court, where we're expecting today one of the biggest decisions ever from that court – a landmark ruling on the constitutionality of the defining achievement of President Obama's first term, the Affordable Care Act. The decision will affect every American. Supporters applaud the provision that prevents insurance companies from canceling coverage due to pre-existing conditions. Opponents say the individual mandate – that requires most Americans to buy insurance or pay a penalty – is unconstitutional. Small business owners say the law's requirement that they provide insurance to all their employees will stifle their growth.

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***** We reported on national, state and local reaction to today's Supreme Court ruling upholding the Affordable Care Act. Our Washington reporter talked to Republican members of Congress, who are vowing to repeal the law. It caught the Governor and Attorney General by surprise. Florida had led the fight against the Act, and Governor Scott ordered the state not to accept federal money for implementing the Act, calling it a tax on Floridians. The interim President and CEO of Sacred Heart Health System issued a statement saying the ruling is "another step toward a goal we support." She said a big benefit is that Physicians and Hospitals will be able to move toward a more efficient payment system that will focus on keeping people healthy. Baptist Hospital said they provided 32.3 million dollars worth of "charity care" in their Pensacola area locations to people who use their emergency room without health insurance...and never pay. Business owners said the ruling will unite the groups that had opposed President Obama and his health plan, and those groups would push forward to get the law repealed. Many residents said they don't like the government mandating what they do, forcing them to buy insurance. Others said they're glad that now everyone will have to pay their own way for health care.

***** Reporter Will Kennedy interviewed local insurance agents, business owners and residents, about the Supreme Court's decision on the Affordable Care Act. Insurance agents are still trying to interpret the Act...one local agent believes that insurance premiums will go up instead of down. Students welcomed the ruling, which provides that they can stay on their parent's insurance plan until age 26.
