* This week's topic was the sinking of the decommissioned aircraft carrier Oriskany as an artificial reef in the Gulf 20 miles south of Pensacola. Gene Ferguson of the Scuba Shop was our guest. He played a role in bringing the ship to the area, and talked about the important safety issues that divers need to know when diving on the site. We discussed the economic impact that this newest tourist attraction will have on the local area.

** Tonight's program presented a sobering analysis of millions of American families who are "Debt Heavy, Cash Poor"...families caught in the trap of multiple credit cards all maxed out, "upside-down" auto financing, and "interest-only" mortgages.

*** Tonight's program focused on the steadily rising cost of gasoline, and how the "Pain at the Pump" is forcing individuals and families to alter their spending on all other items just to be able to pay for fuel for their automobiles. The trend is beginning to have a negative impact on several areas of the economy.

**** We interviewed Okaloosa Airport Director about plans for expanding the Okaloosa Regional Airport. Passenger demand has created a need for more flights, and Director Jerry Sealy is actively trying to lure at least two new carriers to the facility, to join the six companies already flying from the airport. They are hoping to have the expansion designed by next year, and begin building in 2008. In a second story, we talked with Greg Kisela, Destin City Manager, about plans to purchase land along Destin Harbor to build a park and relocate the Destin Fishing Museum, and effort which would help boost business along the waterfront.

***** This week's subject was the planned Maritime Park on the Trillium property on the waterfront in downtown Pensacola. Our guests were Mort O'Sullivan, one of the principal planners of the development, and Charles Fairchild, leader of a movement to force a referendum on the issue by voters in the city of Pensacola. The City Council has already approved the plan, but Fairchild's group has already gathered about 6,000 signatures on a petition to put the issue on a ballot. O'Sullivan says the planners are actively working on the details of preparing for construction of the project, and will continue this work unless told by the City Council to stop. His group is convinced the project will be a huge boost to the economy of downtown Pensacola and the area in general, with plans for a Maritime Museum, a sports stadium and a university learning center.

Supporters hope the public will support the project – already approved by the City Council – to build a public park, maritime museum, sports stadium and university center on the 27-acre parcel of land on Pensacola Bay. They see it as a means to put our city on par with neighboring coastal cities and with the revitalization of downtowns throughout the south.
