^{*} We reported on the meeting of the Escambia County Commission this morning, where commissioners directed staff to start basic research again on expanding Interstate 110 northward. Many residents along the proposed route were at the meeting to protest the route; others were concerned on how the county would pay for the expansion; but most agreed that project is needed to help with hurricane evacuations and accommodate area growth.

**** In our first report, we detailed Santa Rosa County's plans to renew their six-cent-per-gallon tax on gasoline, a move that helps fund county road projects. But the Commission is facing resistance this year from citizens who are paying record high gas prices and want a break from the tax.

Our second report featured the Downtown Improvement Board's final proposed new boundary line for downtown. The proposal still must face a vote from property owners in the areas to be annexed.

A third report was on local beach and county leaders planning to send a resolution to the federal government asking that State Road 399, connecting Navarre Beach to Pensacola Beach, be repaired. They fear that if either bridge connected the island to the mainland were damaged by hurricanes or barge accident, then residents of the island would be stranded.

***** We reported the debate is heating up on where to locate the Interstate 110 expansion route. The County Commission revived a plan to expand the highway to help evacuation efforts when hurricanes threaten. Commissioner Mike Whitehead says the route chosen is the least expensive and least intrusive because it's along a right of way where only power lines run. Residents in neighborhoods along the proposed path are resisting the plan.

****** This week's topic was the proposed Interstate 110 extension. Guests were County Commissioner Mike Whitehead and local Realtor Alexis Bolin. This issue has come up several times, but with renewed interest after the hurricanes of the last 2 years. The need is for a better hurricane evacuation route to the north. The issue was voted down in 2000-2001. This time, to meet federal government guidelines, 5 routes were discussed, with the winning route being from the end of the current I-110, through Jernigan Road on to the new commerce park above Cantonment at Quintet Road. In conjunction with this project would be a separate joint project with Santa Rosa County to build a 4-laned, limited-access highway from Buleah in a loop through Quintet Road over to Santa Rosa County, to give an alternate east-west route to take some of the pressure off 9-Mile Road. Whitehead discussed the county's reasons for supporting the designated route, while Bolin opposed the route, saying the tolls proposed for the extension would not support repaying construction loans.

******** Northwest Florida was the big winner in the base realignment process, and now the region is anticipating a population explosion. Area leaders at Eglin's "Vision 2015" summit today are preparing for this phenomenal growth by making sure there is proper communication between all parties involved. While Eglin Air Force Base prepares for three new missions as a result of BRAC, the surrounding communities have a mission of their own, preparing for twelve thousand new residents that will provide a major boom to the local population and economy. Dr. Rick Harper of the UWF Hass Center projected an economic impact on the order of \$450 to \$500 million a year. In order to handle the growth, Eglin is hosting this Vision 2015 Summit to brainstorm with over 800 people from Pensacola to Panama City. Major General Jeff Riemer, the Eglin AAC Commander, wanted to bring everyone together to one place and start discussing plans to handle the growth, forming committees to work to improve housing, transportation and infrastructure both inside and outside the base gates. They will have to decide where and how to get funds to pay for the improvements and develop a master plan. The area is short on time; the first arrivals will start hitting the base in a few months.
