"Historic Carencro" Mural Unveiling & Blessing

A mural commissioned by physician, Richard Feucht, M.D., and painted by Robert Dafford Murals will be unveiled Sunday morning in downtown Carencro. Father Mark Ledoux of St. Peter Roman Catholic Church will offer a blessing. Media coverage is invited.

Dr. Richard Feucht, Robert Dafford and Carencro city officials will participate in the ceremony.

Feucht commissioned the mural, measuring 20 feet high and 50 feet wide, for the newly constructed building housing the Therapy Center of Carencro. The mural is based on an old photograph of Carencro in 1900, with a view of citizens arriving for mass at St. Peter Roman Catholic Church. Dafford designed the mural using the photo as a main

reference, with other historic photos providing additional details of the time period.

Bradley Jack Phillips, a Carencro native, painted the mural, along with Dafford. Assisting were Chris Pavlik and Lisa Choate. The project involved a month of preparatory work and six weeks of painting.
