**Description:** "From Where I Sit" is a platform designed for international and underrepresented individuals to discuss their life experiences and voice their opinions on culture, current affairs, and the nature of life from their point of view. The show serves as a platform to empower silenced voices and highlight the experience of life through the perspective of individuals outside of the American mainstream. We address issues on and off campus and invite guest speakers to further diversify our perspectives on certain topics.

02/17/23	None	Impending graduation, hosts Khuslen, Jon, and Keshav discuss the impact Hamilton has had on them as internationals and POCs during their time on the Hill. They discuss how they found themselves at the college, what the environment is like and whether they are about leave with adequate preparation for the real world. Topics of immigration and the difficulty of being an international and living in different cultures are discussed.
02/24/23	None	Hosts Khuslen and Jon take over the show to play music from their home cultures of Mongolia and Mexico. They discuss their musical inspirations and how their music tastes formed over time. Some nostalgic songs are played as the pair reflect on the evolution of their friendship and the ability of the modern world to bring people from distinct cultures and countries together in unuusal ways.
03/03/23		Host Keshav takes over the show to play music from across the pond, highlighting seldom heard London-based artist-producers who make US chart topping hits for popstars, older stars like Genesis and Kate Bush, as well as the genre-bending UK Grime/Hip-Hop/R&B scene. He discusses the influence of contemporary music culture in the UK that has historically been heard throughout popular American music, even if

	not explicitly acknowledged.
03/31/23	Returning from Spring break, Keshav and Khuslen dive into the realm of stereotypical ethnic sounds and bring some contemporary Mongolian and Indian dance music to the show in efforts to showcase the dynamic and everchanging nature of sound in other musical cultures, just as it is across different genres in the United States. Host Jon plays Spanish music he describes as "pensive and reflective" for those driving and riding shotgun down the highway, while "terrifying and anxiety inducing" for those riding in the back of the car.
