Section 2. Responsive Programs

1. "Trinity Site Tour", Bob Flotte, Host

Broadcast on April 6, 2018, 7:32 AM to 7:51 AM. Cammy Montoya, White Sands Missile Range Public Affairs, spoke about the site tour coming up on Saturday, the 7th. She alerted our listeners to precautions needed to access the range. No weapons, no picture taking while entering until you get to Ground Zero. She also addressed the need for a full tank of gas, good tires, some snack items and plenty of drinking water. She stressed that the caravan would depart the Tularosa High School parking lot at 8 in the morning. Caravan would be escorted to Trinity Site. Round trip would take about six and one-half hours.

2. "Trinity Site Caravan", Bob Flotte, Host

Broadcast on April 7, 2018, 7:32 AM to &:37 AM. Mary Parra, with the Alamogordo Chamber Ambassadors, those in charge of the caravan line up, presented a recap of the morning startup activity. Three busses already in the lineup. A couple of motor cycles and several vehicles. Some out of country visitors were from Germany, Mexico and other areas. She also reminded our listeners of items forbidden on the range. Example would be guns.

3. Big "A" (Alamogordo) painting on the west slope of the Sacramento Mountains, Bob Flotte, Host.

Broadcast on April 7, 2018, 8:03 AM to 8:23 AM. Rod Saint, a graduate of Alamogordo High School, class of 1987, put together about 25 volunteers to climb up the mountain to paint the Big A, which has been a landmark for Alamogordo over several years. Rod talked about the volunteers being former grads, current students and cheerleaders. He presented credit to organizations in the area that contributed man power and materials to complete the painting project. It should be noted here that Rod Saint is also a candidate for Otero County Sheriff.

Lindsey Totten with Dolly Parton Imagination Library for Otero County, As a Thrive In Southern New Mexico Agency, Discussed how the program provides books for children and the positive impact books have a positive impact on the education of children.

Alamogordo Public Schools \$7 million dollars mill levy election, Bob Flotte, Host.

Broadcast on April 10, 2018, 7:33 AM to 8:21 AM. Adrianne Salas, Superintendent of Alamogordo Public Schools addressed the need for upgrading technology throughout the APS system. She, and her guest, Doyle Syling, from APS, outlined the needs of connecting all of our Alamogordo area schools together with new fiber optic accessabality. The stressed that the \$7M would be used only for upgrading and installing all new technology throughout the system. The need was universal throughout the system. We also talked about the Grade A expresses, a program initiated by NM Governor Martinez, recognizing NM schools for exceptional teaching in the classrooms. Two of our schools received the "A" report.

6. Lincoln National Forest, Extreme Fire Restrictions. Mike Durler Host.

Broadcast April 23, 2018. Ryan Whitaker and Wes Hall, Discussed the recently Extreme Fire Rating and Stage 1 Fire Restrictions placed on the Lincoln National Forrest in the Sacramento Mountains. Also Discussed Campfire Safety and Campfires ONLY Allowed inside Certified Campgrounds. Also discussed what steps to take to protect homes in the forest be clearing any loose leaves and pine needles from roofs, gutters and On ground leaves, pine needles and brush at 30 feet from homes.

7. New Mexico State University-Alamogordo. Mike Durler, Host

Broadcast April 25, 2018 Sherrel Wheeler and Greg Hillis Discussed NMSU-A's On Line Program went from a Low Rating, by the Higher Learning Center, in 2013 to NMSU-A Being The Presenters at the Higher Learning Center Conference in Chicago, in 2018 on How to Build and Deliver a Nationally Recognized On Line Program developed by NMSU-A with Quality Assurance Criteria that is Now A Model for Colleges Across The Country.

8. "Bullying Must Stop", Host, Bob Flotte

Broadcast on April 27, 2018, 3:05 PM to 3:56 PM.

The broadcast began, Live and Local from Cloudcroft, with an interview with Rich Herold, VFW Post 11999, telling Bob about the three day activity including the morning parade on the 17th. Mr. Herold talked about the Warriors in Transition three day event hosted by the Village of Cloudcroft and other participating merchants. The three -day program, was totally free to the War Heroes and their families. It included lodging and free meals and other family events like hiking, biking and free fishing.
