Section 2. Responsive Programs/Answers

- Red, White and Blue July 4th Celebration, KHII/KTMN Staff Members Broadcast July 4, 2018 from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. All Live and Local Our area of Otero County celebrated the July 4th Holiday with a first ever Red, White and Blue Festival all day long on July 4th. The Festival began at 9 a.m. and concluded around 9 p.m. It was twelve hours of music, entertainment, education and just plain ole fun. The Festival drew an estimated 7,500 visitors who, for many, stayed for the entire day. Our broadcast team was there for the entire event. We had several items to give out to our booth visitors. We interviewed City, County and Chamber staff members. Had booth visitors share their story about this first- time event and promoted the entertainment, non -profit organizations and many others. We were also able to give back stage access to some of our on- location winners.
- 2. 39th Mescalero Apache Celebration Parade. Host, Bob Flotte Broadcast, Saturday, July 7, 2018 from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

I had the honor of broadcasting the 39th Annual event on behalf of the Mescalero Apache tribe. This parade marked my 37th year of doing the parade Live and Local from the Homelands of the Mescalero Apache Tribe. We had complete coverage from entry one right on thru the final entry. The two-hour broadcast will high-lighted with Judges interviews and interviews with members of the Mescalero Apache Tribe. Gena Klinekole, a tribal member, co-announced the parade with me. Our coverage was exclusive and was educational because of the history Mrs. Klinekole was able to present. She was born on the Mescalero reservation and had personal knowledge of most of the entries. The Mescalero Apache Parade is one of our most appreciated broadcast for the Mescalero community.

3. Updated program on fire danger in the Lincoln National Forest. Host, Bob Flotte Broadcast on Wednesday, July 11, 2018 from 7:30 a.m. to 8:00 a.m. Our coverage continue on behalf of the Lincoln National Forest to help forest officials continue to warn forest visitors on the grave danger for forest fires. Guests included Denise Ottaviano Acting PIO for the LNF and Wes Hall, LNF Fuels Specialist. Discussion included some of the recent mountain rain which helped to decrease, just a little, the fire danger. Also covered was the continuing fire restrictions in the LNF. Visitors were reminded to use only developed LNF campsites. Restrictions still in effect on building camp fires openly in the forest. Listeners were urged to know before they go by going to Know Before You Go.US/NM. 4. HK Advertising on Branding Initiative for Alamogordo. Host, Bob Flotte Broadcast on Monday, August 13, 2018 from 7:32 a.m. to 7:46 a.m. Vera Hayduk was the morning guest. Vera talked about several community meeting set up to work with all areas of Alamogordo. The input involved any and all community members who desired to help Alamogordo move forward with the same goal in mind. She mentioned a community meeting that night at the Flickinger Center, which I attended, and another meeting the following day during then noon hour. During the conversation, Alamogordo businesses were encouraged to use our new branding in the marketing of their own businesses. 5) APS visiting on new school year. Host, Bob Flotte

Broadcast on Tuesday, August 14, 2018 from 7:04 a.m. to 7:54 a.m.

Adrianne Salas, Superintendent of APS, Michelle Korbakes, Executive Director of Learning Services an Doyle Syling, Chief of Staff, were Bob's guests. Their discussion gave a quick recap of the 2017-18 school year and many of the APS successes. Over \$3M in scholarships awarded. The Grade A Express came to Alamogordo to recognize the system for some schools getting a Grade A report card. We also discussed early enrollment which was down by about 100 students. The conversation also visited on new school hours at Holloman Air Force Base, assigned parking for students at a \$5 fee per year, academic goals established for the 2018-19 year. We also visited on construction progress for our new Sunset Hills Elementary which should be completed by the beginning of the 2019-20 school year. Early in the year, Alamogordo approved a \$7M funding opportunity to bring our IT program up to today's standards.
