Also interviewed was Lisa Rau, Public Relations Director for Silver Dollar City. She reported that the park had a good deal of returning employees this year, which took much of the burden of looking for qualified employees off.</p> <p>The issue of the shortage of people to fill the open positions in Ozark Mountain Country continues to be a problem that the Taney County Partnership is regularly addressing and working on.</p>

Flooding in Missouri and Arkansas	News	5/21/19  5/29/19  6/3/19	Daily Newscasts	:30	<p>Greg Pyron reports in this story that Missouri's Governor, Mike Parson, declares a state of emergency due to the worsening flooding and continued forecasts of severe weather and heavy rain. Flooding in both Missouri and Arkansas continued to be a problem throughout spring and into the summer months. In this story, Pyron sites risks that floodwater poses, such as disease, road damage and sewage, just to name a few, and urged Missourians to keep clear of any flood waters.</p> <p>Our story on May 29<sup>th</sup> announces that the Arkansas Department of Emergency Management was working with other agencies from both Missouri and Tennessee to evacuate people and to also perform water rescues in the state of Arkansas. Interviewed was Barbara Hagger, Public Information Officer with the ADEM.</p> <p>The news story on June 3<sup>rd</sup> warns flood victims of potential scams aimed at them as reported by the AR Attorney General, Leslie Rutledge.</p>
