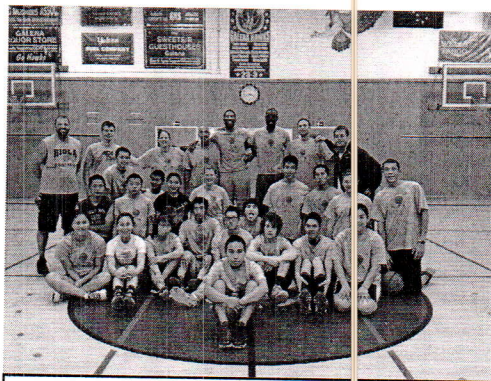
## RECOVERY RECAP SEPTEMBER 2013

- More than \$3.1 million in Federal Individual Assistance was approved as of Sept. 30. This included \$1,343,998 for Housing Assistance and \$1,802,692 for Other Needs Assistance.
- SBA approved over \$3.7 million in loans statewide to 49 individuals and five businesses to provide support to the long-term recovery.
- The State Temporary Housing Program will provide rental assistance for eligible homeowners not covered by FEMA who are willing and able to relocate temporarily outside of Galena. Contact your FEMA caseworker for more information.
- State/FEMA Public Assistance continues work on 27 project worksheets for the repair, restoration and replacement of damaged facilities in Galena. These include Galena's water, sewer and electrical systems and other publicly owned damaged facilities. Mitigation and debris removal funding is also available through FEMA.
- Food and building supplies necessary for rebuilding Galena will be delivered by plane during the winter months. FEMA provides some financial assistance toward shipping costs for repair materials. Contact your caseworker prior to having materials shipped and keep all receipts.
- The Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, United Methodist Committee on Relief, and other agencies continue to support the needs of Galena's pets, both in and out of the community.
- Movie Night will be ongoing throughout the year on Saturdays. All Galena residents and GILA students are invited. Iron Man 3, PG-13, will play Oct. 5.

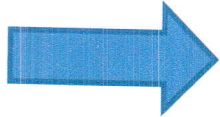

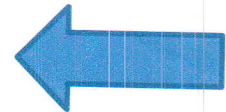

## Radio Announcement

Here is important information from Loudon Tribal Council Administrator March Runner about Property Acquisition and Home Elevation Grants in Galena:

**Property Acquisition in Galena:** Removing structures from flood hazard areas is one of the most effective forms of mitigation. Flood prone properties are purchased from willing sellers, the structures are demolished, and the land becomes open space in perpetuity.

- To qualify you must, among other conditions, have clear title to the property.
- You will receive the fair market value of the land and structures as they were immediately prior to the most recent flood event, subject to applicable adjustments.
- If you have already made repairs to the home, be sure to keep your receipts for any FEMA funded repairs, as well as information about any insurance payouts.
- You can change your mind about participation until the final real estate sale closing.

**Home Elevation in Galena (only homes outside of Old Town would be eligible for elevation grants)** An alternative way to reduce flood damage is to elevate flood prone homes.

- The Community, through the grant program, sponsors eligible homeowners and pays the cost of raising their homes to a minimum elevation of 2 feet above the base flood elevation (BFE), as required by Galena ordinance.
- To qualify, you must have a structurally sound home (capable of being elevated safely), have clear title to the property, and agree to all other terms and conditions of the program.

Property owners interested in possible participation in a Galena Property Acquisition or Home Elevation Grant Program must notify March Runner by September 20<sup>th</sup>, 2013.
