

The following is a summary of Issues/Programs as presented on WTHT, Auburn, ME.

For a period beginning Thursday, March 11th and ending Saturday, March 13th, this station participated in the annual Cares for Kids Radiothon, an effort to raise funds for the Portland-based Barbara Bush Children's Hospital (BBCH). The hospital serves the needs of children and families statewide, and is a crucial community resource. This station devoted over thirty hours of programming over this three-day span, telling the stories of families whose lives have been impacted by the care of BBCH, detailing the different items that listener donations have helped the hospital acquire over the years of the Radiothon, including two specially equipped medical transports that can handle premature babies requiring NICU-level care.

This year's Radiothon helped raise a record-setting \$471,486, a one year increase of nearly \$88,000. All funds raised go directly to equipment, research and treatment at the BBCH.

The following topics/issues were addressed via the weekly "Community Connections" program in the first quarter of 2021.

"Community Connections" is a weekly, 30 minute community affairs program spotlighting organizations and individuals in Maine who address issues affecting citizens, work to improve the quality of life in Maine, and deal with human interest topics across many disciplines.
