A NJ woman was deemed a "vaccine fairy," trying to help give people access to appointments. Dr. Shareef Elnahal of University Hospital in Newark gives an update on how many are vaccinated in NJ. Jennifer Marin took us on a tour of how NJ residents can get monetary incentives for receiving their Covid-19 shot. We caught up with Dr. Meg Fisher, at the State Health Department, about their initiatives to get more people inoculated in the state and its efficacy. Kimberly Kravitz takes you to one Jersey Shore town that will be offering vaccines and Covid tests at the boardwalks. Jennifer Marin talks to doctors and parents about fears about our youth getting the Covid-19 shot.
