"There's a real problem with physician burnout, especially in the primary care venue because of how hard they have to work and how little they're reimbursed."

Delaware had a tragic year in 2018 with about 419 deaths linked to addiction and opioids. When we first talked to the doctor it was around 100. The biggest problem seems to be the fentanyl that is linked.
