ISSUE: TRAIN SAFETY

Joining Coach Johnson is Bill Shanahan, owner of the Coastal Plain Leagues Lexington Blowfish. October 27.

Internet Against Children Task Force DURATION: 29 MIN

ISSUE: CHILD INTERNET SAFETY

Tyler Ryan speaks with former Deputy Attorney General and current 5th Circuit Prosecutor Bethany Miles about work on the Internet Against Children Task Force, the elite team that works to defend children against predators. Tyler and Assistant Solicitor Miles talk about how apps and technology have created opportunities for people who have the mindset to hurt kids. They also discuss the laws surrounding this delicate subject. Assistant Solicitor Miles offers ideas on starting a difficult conversation with children about the dangers on the Internet. The two also discuss Milestone of South Carolina, a non-profit organization that Ms. Miles founded to help children in the Foster Care System in South Carolina, providing support and resources for the kids and host families. November 3.

JDRF DURATION: 29 MIN

ISSUE: DIABETES

Tyler Ryan speaks with Elizabeth McCrary from the JDRF about the affliction, and treatments. Joining Ryan and McCrary are also joined by musical artist Shelby Rae, who lives with Type 1 diabetes, and how she uses music to help tell her story. November 9.

Camp Cole is a 60+ acre camp located between Columbia and Sumter, that is focused on providing camping experiences for children with long-term heathcare needs and terminal illnesses, as well as adults with Autism and First Responders dealing with PTSD and other service related issues. December 1.

Columbia City Ballet/South Carolina Ballet DURATION: 29 MIN

ISSUE: THE ARTS

This week Tyler Ryan visits with the Executive Director of the Columbia City Ballet / South Carolina Ballet William Starrett about his journey to the top of the ballet world, and his nearly 40 years building South Carolina's largest performing arts organization. The two discuss the history of ballet, and the annual favorite performance of The Nutcracker, which tours throughout the Palmetto State. December 8.

Patriot's Point/Yorktown/SC Aquarium DURATION: 29 MIN

Tyler speaks with Chris Hauff from Patriots Point about the Yorktown and other "living' exhibits, as well as plans for expansions. He also speaks with Brent Duncan from the South Carolina Aquarium about the history of the Aquarium, their programs that revolve around conservation, and of course, the educational opportunities. December 15.
