1. POLICE, THE COURT SYSTEM AND CRIME

AMERICA'S MOST WANTED-Network/Public Affairs-Saturdays 8-9 p.m.: One hour show each week that asks for the public's help finding criminals police are looking for that are still on the run.

FOX NEWS AT 9 Local/News-Sunday July 20, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: Massachusetts' Congressman Barney Frank wants to remove federal penalties for "Adults" who smoke small amounts of marijuana for personal use or medical reasons. Others say marijuana is addictive, bad for health and a bigger problem for teens than cigarettes. A 1:15 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9 Local/News-Wednesday, July 30, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: Criminals scheduled to go to trial could walk in Linn County. The courts have gotten way behind since they had to move to Kirkwood Community College after the flood. There have been some criminal cases they have not gotten to, their focus has been on the speedy trial cases first because they have to do those. If court dates are not met, some defendants could walk A :40 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9 -Local/News-Monday, August 25, 2008, 9-10 pm: Security has been increased at events like the Democratic National Convention. Many are attributing that to major national security changes since the attacks on September 11th. A member of the House Homeland Security Committee pushed through a new rail and mass transit security bill in 2007 which authorized \$4 billion to be spent on security improvements for mass transit over a five year period. A 1:20 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9 -Local/News-Tuesday, August 26, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: Police in Miami found a marijuana growing operation in a second floor storage room at the Mall of the Americas. More than 200 plants in all were found which added up to millions of dollars for somebody. There have been no arrests. A :15 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9 -Local/News-Tuesday, September 2, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: Police say good descriptions of criminals mean the difference between capture or escape. Cedar Rapids police say when crimes happen, witnesses often times give very vague descriptions, which are so vague that police have a hard time solving some crimes. If you witness a crime, it is essential to pay close attention to details. A 2:40 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9 -Local/News-Monday, September 8, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: The lawsuits over the touchplay machines continue. Diamond Game Enterprises, a California company that made the machines, has appealed its case over the banned machines. The company argues that the State of Iowa breached their contract when the legislature banned the games back in 2006... A :20 report.

2. EDUCATION AND CHILDREN

FOX NEWS AT 9 -Local/News-Monday July 28, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: Taylor Elementary School is not reopening for the upcoming school year. Taylor's 250 students will be placed in other Cedar

Rapids schools. But Taylor parents presented a petition to the school board and city council to keep the school open.. A 1:10 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Monday July 28, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: Sixty school districts across Iowa have been told to cut their budgets. State records show 17 districts went over their budgets in the 2006-07 school year. Twenty two districts went over in the 2007-08 school year. A :20 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Wednesday July 30, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: The University of Iowa was hard hit by the June floods. They hope to open the English and Philosophy building and Becker Communications building by August 15. . A :55 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Thursday August 28, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: It is back to school for thousands for kids in the Cedar Rapids School District. Many students are still dealing with the after effects of the floods. Viola Gibson housed hundreds of displaced flood victims over the summer. A :40 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Tuesday September 2, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: Students at the University of Iowa need to work on rebuilding their reputation after alleged scandals and sex assaults. It is the hardest for the freshman coming into the University, not knowing what to expect. They keep hearing about the sexual assaults. A :15 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Monday September 8, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: School Board elections are tomorrow and there are some changes for voters in Linn County. For the first time, the county will have voting centers, which means voters don't need to vote in the precinct where they live and can cast their ballots at any voting center within their school district. A :25 report.

3. HEALTHCARE

FOX NEWS AT 9 -Local/News-Sunday July 20, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: The South Los Angeles City Council voted to ban any new restaurants from being built in the area over the next year. They hope the ban will attract other healthier eateries or grocery stores. Thirty percent of the residents in South LA are obese which is 10-15% higher than in other areas. A :45 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Monday July 28, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: The FDA has made a key breakthrough in the salmonella case by finding a new strain of the virus in the irrigation water and a Serrano pepper on a farm in Mexico. Although peppers are a major suspect, officials have not ruled out tomatoes just yet.. A :25 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Wednesday July 30, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: Besides helping clear the air, smoking bans appear to be protecting our hearts. A new report in the New England Journal of Medicine found once Scotland started its public smoking ban, 17% fewer people ended up in the hospital for heart troubles and it only took just 10 months to see the difference. A :15 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Thursday July 31, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: The warden at the Fort Dodge State Prison says he is fed up with convicts breaking the rules by smoking in their cells, so he is moving up plans to ban smoking in state prisons. Under the ban, inmates will not be allowed to order any more tobacco products from the prison commissary. After that, all tobacco will be considered contraband starting November 1st, 2008.. A :20 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Friday August 1, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: The Iowa Department of Public Health says it has logged 550 complaints of illegal smoking statewide and have put 57 businesses on notice. Most businesses seem to be complying with the new law. A :20 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Saturday August 9, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: The University of Iowa is working on a new procedure, called airway bypass to help those people with breathing problems like emphysema. It is minimally invasive and creates new openings in the airway wall. Volunteers are being recruited for a research study. A :25 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Monday September 1, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: The road to recovery from drug addiction is often a long one and meth addicts in particular often have self-esteem issues because of bad teeth caused by the addiction. A program at the House of Mercy addresses both the psychological as well as the cosmetic issues. A 1:55 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Monday September 8, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: Mercy Hospital in Cedar Rapids is celebrating its re-opening after the flood. The ground floor emergency room is back up and running with an all new fast track area for younger patients which includes equipment designed for the younger patients. All ER rooms are private rooms. A :40 report.

4 NEED FOR ECONOMIC GROWTH

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Sunday, July 20, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: Even before the floods, Iowa roads were in tough shape from the harsh winter. Now some lawmakers are asking the Federal Government for funding. The state will spend more than \$180 million over the next two years repairing roads, and the DOT says that is still not enough for the work that needs to be done. A 2:35 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Sunday, July 20, 2008, 9-10 pm: Iowans will be paying more this winter to heat their homes. Natural gas prices are projected to skyrocket. Industry analysts say prices could jump 25% higher than they were last winter. A :40 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Monday July 21, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: Iowa officials say emergency repairs to Iowa's flooded roads will cost at least \$30 million. The repairs are to 464 miles of Iowa's state highway systems and includes more than 300 bridges and culverts. A :20 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Wednesday July 23, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: The Senate voted on a Housing Rescue Bill that includes \$4 billion for local governments to re-develop foreclosed properties and \$300 billion to guarantee mortgages for borrowers who could lose their homes. The enterprises that back those mortgages- Freddie Mac and Fannie Mae are now being backed up by the government . A :20 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Monday July 28, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: The next US President will have an unwelcome record waiting for him when he takes office. It is a budget deficit approaching a staggering \$490 billion, which is an all time high. The deficit is being driven by the sagging economy and the stimulus payments made to 130 million households . A :25 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Monday July 28, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: The future of Cedar Rapids hinges on \$5 million and 3 year. It is a major study by the Army Corps of Engineers, to put together a combination of tools to fight future floods. A :40 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Tuesday July 29, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: The Iowa City and Coralville job market is booming with nearly 1500 jobs that have been created over the past year. The need for workers stretches across a lot of different industries. Iowa City expects this trend to continue with another 1500 new jobs within the next two years. A :45 report

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Tuesday July 29, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: Despite near record market prices, hog farmers are losing money as grain prices rise even quicker. A 3:20 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Wednesday July 30, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: President Bush has signed a massive housing bill giving mortgage relief for 400,000 people. The law lets those who can't afford their payments to refinance into more affordable government backed loans instead of losing their homes. A :15 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Monday August 25, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: The US Postmaster General says the US Post Office may lose \$2 billion this year because of the struggling economy. The Postmaster suggests one possible way to bring in more money is advertising through the mail. A :20 report

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Saturday August 30, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: Employees of the Crowne Plaza Hotel in downtown Cedar Rapids which is owned by Kronos Hotels of Atlanta, wait to see if their checks will be good when cashed. Employees have to go to Iowa City to cash their checks. A :45 report

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Monday September 1, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: The General Manager of the Crown Plaza Hotel was fired yesterday because he told the media too much information about the hotel's financial problems. Those problems include bounced paychecks for employees. Another problem is that Kronos, the company that owns the Crowne Plaza, is taking out the cost of things like health insurance, but employees say their health insurance was cancelled because the premiums were not being paid by Kronos. A 2:25 report

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Monday September 8, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: President Bush signed an order increasing the federal share of disaster aid to Iowa to 90% of eligible costs. It also expands the disaster aid to include debris removal and rebuilding of public facilities. A :20 report

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Wednesday September 10, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: Monsanto broke ground for a new corn seed plant in Buchanan County near Independence, which will pack up to 1200 bags of corn seed per hour and employ 40 full time workers and 1000 part time workers. A :40 report

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Sunday September 28, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: The Elk Run Power Station is hoping to break ground in Black Hawk county with a new \$1.3 billion coal fired power plant. But opponents say the plant would pump harmful pollutants into the air. The Iowa DNR still has to review the plant's application and set a timetable for those public hearings. A :15 report

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Monday July 28, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: It is one of the sad ironies in the Floods of 2008. Many of the buildings at historic Usher's Ferry moved there years ago because they were at risk for flooding. Then the flood hit, and the high water knocked down walls and whole buildings were moved . A 2:30 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Tuesday July 29, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: The Linn Community Food Bank is back open at the 5th Street Presbyterian Church, and helping those in need. A :30 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9-Local/News-Wednesday, July 30, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: President Bush is asking lawmakers to reconsider allowing off shore drilling for oil. The President wants Congress to open up more coastline, and the Alaskan Arctic for oil exploration. A :20 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9 -Local/News-Wednesday, July 30, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: The future of Cedar Rapids depends on a major undertaking by the Army Corps of Engineers, a \$5 million study over the next 3 years to guide flood prevention efforts. A 3:10 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9 -Local/News- Thursday July 31, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: Twenty four historic buildings in Czech Village are ready to begin reconstruction, but these buildings don't have enough tax credits and the credits have already been committed and are not available. A :20 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9 -Local/News- Monday August 25, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: There is good news in high gas prices, roads are safer. A Michigan University study reports there could be less than 37,000 traffic deaths nationwide for the first time since 1961. When gas prices spiked, fatalities dropped 22% this March, and almost 18% in April. A :50 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9 -Local/News- Thursday August 28, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: Some Northern Iowa farmers say Iowa could become more energy independent if it were easier for land owners to build wind turbines and sell the electricity themselves. As it is now, utilities and big developers own most of the turbines and keep most of the profits. A :40 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9 -Local/News- Saturday August 30, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: In some areas across the state of Iowa, there has been less than two inches of rain the entire month of August. The dry spell is more of a top soil or shallow dryness. A 2:20 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9 -Local/News- Sunday August 31, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: Cedar Rapids, along with the Linn County Supervisors have hired a lobbying firm to help get more federal money to rebuild affordable housing. Mayor Halloran hopes the lobbyists will be able to cut through a lot of red tape in what she calls a surprising and convoluted system. A :20 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9 -Local/News- Sunday August 31, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: Iowans need to think before approving buyouts. Iowa Homeland Security and Emergency Management warns that the federal buyout program turns property into green space forever which can totally change the look of a community. A :20 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9 -Local/News- Monday September 8, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: As people rebuild in the Time Check area, many are questioning the city's attempts to repair levees. Right now, there

are piles of mud sitting on top the levees along 1st Street. The City calls it a temporary fix, but people who live in the area want to see more done to rebuild the area. A :40 report.

FOX NEWS AT 9 -Local/News- Monday September 22, 2008, 9-10 p.m.: Speaker of the House, Nancy Pelosi assures Iowans more help is headed their way. In Cedar Rapids, Pelosi got a first hand look at the devastation in Czech Village before making her way to the Museum of Art to address the media. A 2:10 report.
