Community Calendar:

CW 22 Community Calendar

Local non-profit organizations utilize this community service project to promote local community events and activities. The events and activities included support group meetings to talk about important issues, and charity events that help raise money for important causes. The Community Calendar airs daily at 10am. It is 60 seconds in length and is comprised of 3 announcements at 20 seconds each.

Public Service Announcements:

In addition to the attached, WLFL aired public service announcements covering a number of topics which include the following subject matter: **Crime, Drugs/Alcohol, Education, Employment/Economy, Environment, Health, Youth/Teens, Volunteering, Fitness, Family and Government, and DTV transition.** During the 4th quarter of 2021, WLFL aired approximately 5 hours of public service announcements. These public service announcements range

from 10 seconds to 60 seconds in length. The public service announcements aired daily between sign on to sign off seven days a week

Locally produced Public Service Announcements:

Creature Feature- each week we feature two animals that need homes with information on the animal and how viewers can adopt the animal. On average will air these spots twice a day.
