The attached is a compiled list of program descriptions of public affairs shows, which WLFL produced to serve the community's interest during the 1st quarter (January 1st through March 31st 2003) of the broadcast calendar year.

Community Calendar:

WB 22 Community Calendar

Local non-profit organizations utilize this community service project to promote local community events and activities. The Community Calendar airs daily at 12 noon. It is 60 seconds in length and is comprised of 3 announcements at 20 seconds each.

In the 1st quarter, WLFL aired approximately 55 announcements for a total of 55 minutes of community announcements.

Public Service Announcements:

In addition to the attached, WLFL aired public service announcements covering a number of topics which include the following subject matter: **Crime**, **Drugs/Alcohol, Education, Employment/Economy, Environment, Health, Youth/Teens, Volunteering, Fitness, Family and Government.** During the 1st quarter of 2002, WLFL aired approximately 20 hours of public service announcements. These public service announcements range from 10 seconds to 60 seconds in length. The public service announcements aired daily between sign on to sign off seven days a week (Attached is a complete list of Public Service Announcements aired during 1st quarter)
