**General Information:**

WNJR-FM is a noncommercial educational radio station operated by Washington & Jefferson College in Washington, Pennsylvania. WNJR-FM broadcasts twenty-four hours a day, including music, syndicated programming, and live shows hosted by W&J students, faculty, and staff.

Description Part 1: September is “National Preparedness Month.” The holiday was established by the federal government in order to “raise awareness about the importance of preparing for disasters and emergencies that could happen at any time.” The 2023 theme is “Take Control in 1, 2, 3,” which focuses on “older adults for disasters, specifically older adults from communities that are disproportionately impacted by the all-hazard events.” [<https://www.ready.gov/september>]

Questions considered: Have you ever experienced a violent storm or weather-related emergency? Do you and your family have a readiness plan in place for various emergencies? What would you put into your own emergency preparation kit?

Description Part 2: September 21 is the “International Day of Peace,” established in 1981 by the United Nations General Assembly. The oldest African American-owned farm in the U.S., located in Pennsylvania, received a special dedication leading up to the 250th birthday of America.

We'll also hear about a new study that looks at radioactive materials in waterways, which could have come from wastewater treatment plants that accept landfill runoff contaminated with fracking waste.
