Submission of requested information for each of 3ABN Class A TV station

Three Angels Broadcasting Network, Inc. ("3ABN"), licensee of a number of Class A Television stations, by its Director of Broadcasting Operations & Engineering, and pursuant to the Commission's letter of March 13, 2012, hereby submits the answers and supporting data, for the Six (6) questions the FCC raised.

First of all, I would like to submit to you the report from Orchard Media Services. As it clearly states, 3ABN hired that organization in April of 2011 to perform the Alternative Broadcast Inspection Program (ABIP) to all 16 Class A stations owned by 3ABN. Please see enclosed Certificates for K08MM, K12OZ, K21DO, K43FO. Unfortunately, due to an unpredictable health problem, the inspector Ken Orchard was not able to complete the inspection of the rest of Class A stations. The Certificates are valid for three (3) years from the issuing date.

As demonstrated below, 3ABN has shown a good cause and diligent effort to fully comply with the requirements for Class A, as described on CBPA.

Health Problems came up and I did not get to visit the remaining 12 stations.

At about Oct. 2011 I was diagnosed with Prostate Cancer was scheduled to be operated.

That operation occurred in December 2011.

After a few months of recovery I am not ready to tackle the inspections of the other 12 Class A TV stations as outlined in your letter to Three Angels.

Because I got behind due to health issues I can now drive and set for long distance and would like to start, let's say June 1, 2012. It covers many states and would be about a 10,000 trip.

The project would take at least 6-9 months.


Three Angels is the second largest religious Broadcaster in the Nation.


