They support all fire fighters and EMT for any missing person's case. Mountain Maryland has trailing dogs which can pick up on scent trails for Urban and Wooded areas. If there is someone lost in a 30-to-40-acre area, they'll use an air scent dog to pick-up on air-currents and seek out where it's coming from. Their dogs are trained from HRD. All the animals are pets, and everyone is a volunteer. If you wish to join you can come to their open house May 22nd at Allegany College of Maryland. No walk-in's allowed unless it is to get a Tetanus shot, which needs to be up to date every ten years.
