This is part one of our look back at 2023. From Palestine to a myriad of protests; from the climate crisis, to police terror, to the African Sahel: this year was a time of continuing and tremendous crisis for the world's global majority. And it was a time of resistance and for challenging U.S. empire like never before.

When international human rights activist Issa Amro visited Washington, DC in January 2023, dozens of Palestinians in the West Bank had already been murdered in the new year by IDF soldiers and illegal Jewish settlers. Also at the start of 2023, the brutal beating and murder of Tyre Nichols by Memphis police, captured on surveillance camera, reinforced the systemic nature of police abuse in the United States. This show also includes my conversation with 2016 GREEN party presidential candidate Jill Stein at the MARCH ON WASHINGTON FOR PEOPLE'S NEEDS, NOT THE WAR MACHINE March 18th 2023 near the White House. Those opposed to President Biden's approval of the Mountain Vally Pipeline rallied outside the White House on June 8. Pro-Palestinian demonstrators staged worldwide protests to call for a ceasefire in the Gaza Strip on November 4. Pacifica's Thomas O'Rourke reports on the massive rally held in Washington DC. On November 3 dozens of supporters of Palestine entered a restricted area at the Port of Oakland and stopped a Pentagon Ready Reserve Fleet ship carrying military cargo to Israel. Participants spoke to Pacifica's Steve Zeltzer about why they were trying to stop the ship. Ongoing Israeli war crimes in Palestine have caused diplomatic reverberations in Latin America. The nation of Bolivia has severed official relations with Israel, while other countries have recalled their ambassadors to Israel in protest over Israeli atrocities. Don Debar speaks with Nicaragua-based journalists Camila Escalante and Stephen

Sefton. Over 100 healthcare workers and unionists rallied at San Francisco General Hospital to demand an end to the bombing. South African unionist Memethlwe Sebei talks about a national labor tribunal on the situation of workers in Namibia, the workers struggle in South Africa and the connection between the Zionist regime in Israel and apartheid South Africa.

March 1st marks the anniversary of the US backed 2004 coup vs Haiti's first democratically elected government under Jean-Bertrand Aristide. Aristide was ousted in the 2004 coup after right-wing ex-army paramilitaries invaded the country from across the Dominican border. The United States helped orchestrate the coup against him. Aristide was later forced into exile in the Central African Republic and South Africa. The tactics that were used to remove Aristide from power twice are almost identical to the ones being used against Venezuela's Maduro today.
