October 3, 2023 – *As AI tech expands, a look at how it's used and could be used in Southern Nevada*

- Artificial intelligence isn't something that we hope to witness one day, it's already here.

October 17, 2023 – *Live from UNLV: Impact of university arts programs extends well beyond Las Vegas*

- UNLV has long defied the myth that Las Vegas is a cultural wasteland, especially in recent years.

October 25, 2023 – *Nevada's Public Option begins in 2026. Here's what it means for your health insurance*

- The cost of everything is going up and that includes health care. So two years ago, Democrats in the Nevada Legislature passed a plan that they say will keep healthcare costs in check.
