## ***Jan 9, 2023 - North Las Vegas' historic new mayor: 'The vision is economic growth'***

- When Pamela Goynes-Brown was elected mayor of North Las Vegas last month, she became the first Black mayor in Nevada.

## ***Jan 20, 2023 - At Nevada interfaith event, Indigenous religious practices shared, discussed***

- Even with 27 tribal groups of different types in Nevada, not a lot is known about how these communities live and work. But even less is known about their religious beliefs.

## ***Feb 2, 2023 - Police reform in Southern Nevada: What needs to be done?***

- The beating death of Tyre Nichols last month by five Memphis police officers spurred a downtown Las Vegas protest on Fremont Street last weekend.

## ***Feb 24, 2023 - Shortage, high cost of childcare in Nevada affecting workforce***

- We all heard of the supply chain problems during the pandemic. For the most part, they've disappeared. But there's one supply shortage that's sticking around and Nevada and other states are trying to figure out what to do about it. It's the lack of child care.

## ***Mar 6, 2023 - Women's healthcare is hard to come by in Nevada. New bills could help.***

- For many years, Nevada hasn't had enough doctors for its growing population. Today, it ranks 48th in the country for primary doctors per person.

## ***Mar 28, 2023 - Avi Kwa Ame monument protects 500,000 acres sacred to 12 Nevada tribes***

- Last Tuesday, President Joe Biden designated Avi Kwa Ame as a national monument. At more than 500,000 acres, it's home to native rock art, the world's largest Joshua tree forest and the driving force for its designation — it's sacred to 12 Indigenous tribes.
