He wants to know how he can help her to better understand God's love and learn to trust again. Dawson said that Daniel can be there for her and be trustworthy, but God needs to do this work in her. Dawson said that both of them need to take some time to grow. He reminded Daniel that her 6 children are a lot of responsibility and he is still recovering from coming out of prison. He suggested that Daniel slow down and wait on the Lord. He said neither of them is ready to help carry the other person's load.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Worried About Losing His Salvation</b>            Dylan is struggling with his salvation. He has believed in Jesus since he was little, but he didn't really understand what giving his life to the Lord meant until about 2 years ago. Since then he has gone through a lot of stuff, and is worried about losing his salvation. Dawson said the fact that he is concerned about this is a good sign that he is in the right path; if he wasn't he wouldn't care about it as much as he does. Dawson invited the listeners to call in with their encouragement for Dylan.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Peer To Peer Advice For Dylan</b>            believes that once you make the commitment to God that opens the door to a relationship that can never end. Nicole has had times where she has strayed from God, but like any relationship you come back running. She said that when she is drifted God is always there to pull her back.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Peer To Peer Advice For Dylan</b>            Tom struggled with this same issue for a couple of years. He quoted a scripture that says "I write these things that you may know you have eternal life". He reminded Dylan that if you are trusting your works, you will be judged by them, but if you are trusting in your salvation by the blood of Christ than that is all it takes.</p>

He says it is a lie, but he abused Tiffany growing up. Since then they have tried keeping the kids away. Now her parents are threatening to take them to court for visitation rights. Dawson said that if he was an abuser to her growing up nothing would change with his grandkids. He said that Tiffany is at war to protect her kids. Dawson said to get a tough lawyer and get advice on the next steps. He reminded her that her first responsibility is to take care of her kids.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Girlfriend's Parents Do Not Approve</b>            Michael dated a girl for about 4 years off and on. Now they want to get back together but her parents are not in agreement with that. Dawson said that Michael needs to see what her parents want from him to show them that he is a different person. He has hurt her in the past so he is going to have to walk a long road to show them that he has changed. He told Michael that it is going to be really hard and if he wants to do it he needs to get a good counselor. He recommended that Michael go to the prayerzone.com to find people who will pray with him about his next steps.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Messed Up, Couldn't Intern As Pastor</b>            Adrian was all set up to intern as a youth pastor but he "messed up" morally. He sought the Lord and felt forgiven. He confessed his sin to the pastors but they said he couldn't intern anymore. He felt like he was not forgiven. He thought about going to another church to have a fresh start but the leadership at his church is telling him it is a bad decision. Through prayer and Bible study Adrian feels like God might be leading him to make this change. Dawson invited the listeners to call in with their advice for Adrian.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Peer To Peer Advice For Adrian</b>            Tamra is 26 and 4 years ago she went through a divorce. Her church now was very loving, but the church she grew up in was not loving and would not have forgiven her. Tamra said that he should go to another church because Adrian's current church doesn't sound scripturally sound.</p>

She used drugs such as acid in college and the medications helped her get over that, but now she is suffering from lack of control over her muscle movement. Ashley's primary doctor dropped her, and she feels her family doesn't support or understand her. Dawson invited the listeners to call in with their advice and encouragement for Ashley.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Peer To Peer Advice For Ashley</b> Christina wanted to let Ashley know that she can find freedom in the name of Jesus. Christina has received healing in different situations where medical doctors failed her and encouraged Ashley to trust God for her healing.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Peer To Peer Advice For Ashley</b> Tracy has bi-polar disorder that was made worse by drug abuse, similar to Ashley. Tracy said that Ashley is taking the right steps and encouraged her to find a Christian counselor. Tracy said that she is not alone in this struggle and encouraged her to let the Lord use this as an opportunity to draw her closer.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Peer To Peer Advice For Ashley</b> Kevin has a very similar story to Ashley. He tripped on mushrooms in 10<sup>th</sup> grade and after that dealt with a lot of anxiety. He is convinced that there is a strong spiritual battle at play. He said it is really tough to find the right medicine, and for Kevin it took 23 different tries. He said that Ashley needs to trust God and trust her instinct; he advised her to advocate for herself if she feels her medication is not right.</p>

Dawson said that pursuing the dream doesn't mean he has to quit the dental business and that he isn't in an either or situation at this point. Dawson suggested that Colby talk to his family about this and ask for their advice and prayer for how to pursue his dream. He reminded Colby that there is wisdom in having an abundance of counselors. Dawson encouraged Colby and his friend to start writing songs and then look into going to youth groups to share their music and then see what happens after a year or two of doing this.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Dealing With Depression</b> Mickey is dealing with depression. She works 3 jobs and goes to school and is also overweight. She doesn't feel like anything is going write. She prays and asks for God's help but nothing seems to work. Mickey said she just doesn't know where to start. Dawson told Mickey that he is going to invite the listeners to call in with their advice and encouragement for Mickey.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Peer To Peer Advice For Mickey</b> Rachel has been exactly where Mickey is. She struggled with depression and has prayed to God for relief without finding an answer. The way she got out of it was by going to therapy and taking medication. Rachel encouraged Mickey that therapy and medicines are things God can use to equip you to deal with your depression.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Peer To Peer Advice For Mickey</b> Jeff was 12 years old when he was in the same place as Mickey. Now he is a RN and is able to help others. He suggested that Mickey make a priority list and sort what is urgent, important, and what can wait. He also suggested Mickey look for a good counselor. Finally, Jeff suggested exercising because that helps release endorphins that will help.</p>

Even though his girlfriend has talked about giving her life to Christ, he told Sawyer that he cannot be the person to disciple her.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Falsely Accused, Dealing With Anxiety</b> Dustin was falsely accused of a felony and was facing 25 years to life in prison. The charges were dropped eventually, but he lost his job. Now he is having issues with anxiety. He is trying to go back to school but is having a hard time coping. Dawson said that Dustin needs to work with a HopeCoach to get to the bottom of what is causing Dustin's anxiety. He said they will need to take it step by step to get to the root of the issue.</p> <p><b>TITLE: God Has Brought Him Through A Lot</b> David listens to the show a lot and is always reminded how God has brought him through so much and what he has done for him. He wanted to thank Dawson for such a great show that helps him through the day. Dawson said that David is going the right thing by surrounding himself with wholesome words and thoughts.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Found Out Fiancé Was Cheating</b> Taylor was in a 4-year relationship and they were engaged. She moved to NJ from Florida to be closer to him, and found out that he was cheating on her. Taylor comes from a Christian family, but he isn't open to God. Dawson said that Taylor was out of God's will being in a relationship with someone who wasn't a Christian. He told Taylor that God allowed her to see that he was cheating to help her get out of the situation before it went any further. Dawson said now she can start the process of moving forward.</p>

Dawson said that she wasn't listening to God at the beginning and so listening to Him now is the right thing. Dawson reminded Krystle that God loves her with an everlasting love and will help her through the consequences of her actions. Dawson invited the listeners to call in with their thoughts and advice for Krystle.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Peer To Peer Advice For Krystle</b>            Mikaela said that Krystle is really going to have to cut ties with this guy, including social media. She said to go through her Bible and find out what love really is and remind herself that what she experienced with this guy wasn't real love.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Peer To Peer Advice For Krystle</b>            Liz said that plugging in at her church and finding a place where she could serve helped her heart to heal. She said the more she gave to Him the more she felt His presence and could hear His voice. She also came to appreciate the people who worked alongside her as a support system. She told Krystle that she was made in God's image and the more she works to become like Him the closer to Him she will feel.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Fell In Love With Working With Youth</b>            Emory worked at a camp over the summer and fell in love with working with youth. He blames the cheating on Ashley and says if she had or had not done certain things he wouldn't have cheated. Ashley said he also lies a lot. Ashley has stayed with him until now because they have children. Dawson said Ashley has grounds to leave him in multiple areas. He also said Ashley shouldn't want her children exposed to these types of behaviors. Dawson's recommendation is to end this marriage, especially for the sake of her children.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Frustrated, Has Had A Rough Year</b>            Brittany has had a rough year. When her youngest baby was 4 weeks old her husband left her. Brittany wanted to go through counseling and try to save their marriage, but he had already found someone else. After that, her child received his 12-month vaccinations and had a severe reaction. He stopped talking when that happened and it has been two and a half years. Her son is going through therapy but they think he may be mildly autistic. Now Brittany has been diagnosed with Bell's Palsy. Brittany has been frustrated and struggles with her relationship with the Lord. She realizes God didn't cause this and she is trying to lean on Him. Dawson said Brittany needs some prayer and encouragement and he would ask people to call in to give her that.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Peer To Peer Advice For Brittany</b>            Allison has a very similar story to Brittany. She had an older son diagnosed with autism and also had Bell's Palsy that lasted about 17 weeks. She said that no matter what is going on in her life, God isn't surprised by it. She recommended standing on the promises of Psalm 139. Dawson invited those listening who may have gone through this to call in with their advice.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Peer To Peer Advice For Jonathan</b> John has been through the same situation that Jonathan is in. John met his wife when they were young, and one day after they were married she walked away. He shared the old saying that "if you love someone, let them go, if they are really yours they will come back to you". He said letting his wife go left him no where to turn but to God and really build a relationship with Him. John said that relationships can only work long term once both parties have a real relationship with Him.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Peer To Peer Advice For Jonathan</b> Jennifer wanted Jonathan to know that God is not punishing him. She went through similar stuff when she was younger. She said that pain can be blinding and make you feel like you are being punished, but really it is God just giving him an opportunity to adjust his perspective. Dawson said that there can be victory on the other side and feels like there may be many listeners who have been through this type of thing and can share their advice and encouragement with her.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Peer To Peer Advice For Janely</b>            Caleb's wife was abused by her father for many years as well as being raped as a 14-year old. What she is feeling now is indescribably painful especially when it is bottled up. His wife is completely healed now and has forgiven her rapist and her father. He said you have to accept and acknowledge what happened, and then let those emotions out so that God can bring healing.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Peer To Peer Advice For Janely</b>            Jermaine said that sharing what happened to her is the first step in her healing. He encouraged her to continue talking about it to people she can trust. Jermaine's wife was raped by a family member and her mother knew about it. She prayed to God every night for the strength and ability to forgive, and that is what helped her get past it. He also said not to allow the enemy to put any fear in her that she did anything to cause this to happen to her.</p>

He invited the listeners to call in and give their advice and encouragement for her.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Peer To Peer Advice For Sarah</b> Rachel asked Sarah what her school schedule was and if she could possible reduce her course load. Dawson advised Sarah to slow down on her schoolwork if needed so that she can be there for her baby and husband.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Jealous Of Brother And His Calling</b> Rachel has been struggling with jealousy toward her brother. She feels like he is getting the call from God on his life that Rachel has always wanted for hers. Her brother is a worship leader and is writing songs, and Rachel has been trying to do that for a really long time. A lot of her friends at church feel like they are settled into what their calling is and she doesn't have that. Dawson said that Rachel needs to just focus on seeking God for Himself, and the calling will come. He also said that jealousy can be really damaging and that she needs to deal with that before she can start to discover her calling.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Feels Alone, Struggling With Depression</b> Perry is struggling with depression and feeling alone. He is blind. When his mom leaves the house there is no one to talk to and he can't drive to go see friends. Perry has a girlfriend but she also has vision problems and also is very depressed. Perry has tried to talk to his mom but she doesn't seem to listen. Dawson suggested that Perry talk to his pastor and also get his mom involved in those conversations. He said that maybe if his mom understood how bad his depression is some steps can be taken to help him feel better.</p>

A coworker witnessed this and called him a "woman beater". This coworker continued to threaten and insult him, so he didn't come to work the next day to avoid conflict. After this he was fired from his job. Even now he is getting threatening notes and messages. Nathan isn't sure if he did the right thing by leaving to avoid conflict. Dawson said that at this point he would let the job go. As far as the people go, he suggested maybe taking his Facebook down for a time. He also suggested to take 30 days and spend 5 minutes a day praying for the ability to forgive these people and for God to bless them. Then after that, he can make a decision about what to do next.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Ready To Get Engaged</b>  Justin has a really good female friend. They dated in the past, but Justin is ready to get engaged to his current girlfriend. His soon to be fiancé has problems with Justin and his ex's friendship. Dawson said he was going to get some callers to give their experience and advice about Justin's situation.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Peer To Peer Advice For Justin</b>  Yolle advised that Justin think through his relationship with his ex, and consider what it is that is making him feel like he is the one that needs to be in her life encouraging her. She also suggested setting boundaries, and asking his girlfriend what he can do to make her feel comfortable with this friendship.</p> <p><b>TITLE: Peer To Peer Advice For Justin</b>  Sophie recently got engaged and they went through a similar situation. Ultimately, Sophie recognized that her fiancé's heart was right and that she was dealing with insecurities, but even still setting boundaries offers the relationship security. She suggested setting boundaries where he doesn't hang out one-on-one with his ex.</p>
