KCQQ provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **arts, cancer survival, disabilities, blood donation:** Daniel Sheridan from Junior Theatre talks about what's ahead for the new theater and location, as well as the importance of arts in the community. Lexi Bull talks about the Angerer Eats and Live From The QC It's Saturday Night fundraisers for Gilda's Club Quad Cities. Jennifer Davis talks about Special Olympics Illinois and the impact the organization has on people with disabilities.
- **arts, cancer survival, mental health:** Daniel Sheridan from Junior Theatre talks about what's ahead as they try to find a new place. Daniel Sheridan also talks about the importance of the arts to the community. Emily Schrank from Davenport Central High School continues the discussion of the arts and a show choir event coming up and how both sides of the river can show their support for our youth and the arts.
