KMHD 89.1 FM is formatted as a jazz music station with both national and local music programming. Its largest population is in the Portland Metropolitan area. Apart from music, KMHD broadcasts morning and afternoon weekday newscasts to serve listeners with the most pertinent news of the day with updates as necessary.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

OPB Newscasts are provided by OPB (Oregon Public Broadcasting) to KMHD 89.1 FM. Broadcasts are weekday mornings from 7:04-7:07a and 8:04-8:07a and weekday afternoons 4:04-4:06p and 5:04-5:06p. Newscasts are composed of news reports about the Northwest and produced by radio staff of OPB and the Northwest News Network (N3), a consortium of public radio stations throughout the Northwest.

Philosophy Talk is a weekly, one-hour radio series aired 3:00 – 4:00 am Mondays. It is produced by Ben Manilla Productions. The hosts, Ken Taylor, Debra Satz, Josh Landy and John Perry, have a down-to-earth and no-nonsense approach that brings the richness of philosophic thought to everyday subjects. The topics are lofty, arresting and engaging.
