1. YOUTH / EDUCATION -- Education is a continual concern among residents of Central Illinois. Funding for extra-curricular activities, scholarships and other funding for college are just some of the concerns. This station is programming positive information about education, and helping where possible. Central Illinois youth is also a concern with citizens.
