DR. OZ

MONDAY – FRIDAY 7:00AM TO 8:00AM; 10:05PM to 11:05PM

Dr. Oz has won Ten Daytime Emmy Awards for “The Dr. Oz Show”. He is an attending physician at NY Presbyterian-Columbia Medical Center and still performs dozens of heart operations annually. Dr. Oz received his undergraduate degree from Harvard University in 1982 and obtained a joint MD and MBA from the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine and Wharton Business School in 1986. He has authored over 400 original publications, book chapter and medical books.

Previously, Dr. Oz was featured as a health expert on “The Oprah Winfrey Show” for six seasons, Dr. Mehmet Oz, dispenses advice on healthy living. He has published eight New York Times Best Sellers. He co-founded Sharecare.com which won “Best Medical App” award for AskMD in 2014 and its DoctorOz app was nominated for an Emmy in 2017. In 2003, Dr. Oz founded Heathcorps which emulated the Peacecorps by putting energetic recent college graduates into high schools around the country to teach diet, fitness and mental resilience. Over a million teens have been influenced by this nationwide program.

Dr. Oz has been named Time magazine’s 100 Most Influential People, Forbes’ most influential celebrity, Esquire magazine’s 75 Most Influential People of the 21st Century, a Global Leader of Tomorrow by the World Economic Forum, Harvard’s 100 Most Influential Alumni, and many other honors.

The Dr. Oz Show’s first episode date was September 14, 2009. Topics covered on The Dr. Oz Show include health, wellness, fitness, diet and nutrition, sleep, skin care, true crime, and beauty information. Information relevant to COVID 19, diabetes, aging, weight loss, and other health topics are often addressed.

From the producers of Judge Judy, HOT BENCH adds a new dimension to the court genre, with a panel of three judges hearing court cases, arguing the merits of the case amongst themselves and rendering a verdict. 'Hot Bench' is a term used to describe a court where the judge or judges frequently interrupt lawyers' presentations with questions, often leading to lively exchanges. A variety of topics related to law, crime, public safety, and education are regularly addressed.

"When my husband Jerry and I were in Ireland recently, we visited the courts and watched a three-judge bench, which I found both fascinating and compelling," Judge Judy Sheindlin said. "I immediately thought what a terrific and unique idea for a television program that brings the court genre to the next level. We have assembled three individuals with extremely varied backgrounds to serve as the judges. They are smart and talented, with terrific instincts and great chemistry, and are sure to create a "hot bench."

HOT BENCH's trios of judges are Judge Patricia DiMango, Judge Michael Corriero and Judge Tanya Acker.

Tanya Acker is an experienced litigator who has represented a wide variety of clients. She is a Yale Law School graduate and served as a judicial law clerk to the Honorable Dorothy Wright Nelson on the Ninth U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals. After her clerkship, the Office of the Solicitor General in the U.S. Department of Justice awarded her a Bristow Fellowship. In private practice, Acker's legal work spanned a variety of matters from civil litigation involving public and private entities, to various constitutional cases, to the provision of business counseling and advice. She also maintained a commitment to pro bono work, receiving the ACLU's First Amendment Award for her successful representation of a group of homeless individuals against the City of Santa Barbara. She maintains an active involvement in various philanthropic, civic and business organizations.

Patricia DiMango was first appointed to serve as a judge in the criminal courts for the city of New York by Mayor Rudolph Guiliani. Thereafter she was elected to the New York State Supreme Court bench in the 2nd and 11th Judicial Districts. She became the Italian American woman ever appointed to these positions. Soon after, she was elevated to the position of First Deputy Administrative Judge for criminal matters, 2nd Judicial District. Her reputation as stern and fair assisted her in handling a large volume of serious felony cases from their arraignment through trial including a number of high-profile trials. Awards include Alumna of the Year from Brooklyn college, the Rapallo Award, the Distinguished Judiciary Award from the Catholic Lawyers Guild, and Woman of the Year by the New York State Supreme Court Officers Association. She received her law degree from St. John's University where she graduated in the top 10 percent of her class. She also holds a Master's Degree from Columbia University in Developmental Psychology. While pursuing her Master's Degree, Justice DiMango was a school teacher for the New York City Public Schools, focusing on special education of children with emotional and intellectual deficiencies.

Michael Corriero served as a prosecutor in the office of Manhattan District Attorney Frank Hogan, a criminal defense attorney and a judge for 28 years in the criminal courts of New York State. For 16 years he presided over Manhattan's Youth Part, a special court he created in the Supreme Court of New York State designed to focus attention and scarce resources on young offenders prosecuted as adults pursuant to New York State's Juvenile Offender law. This program became a model for mobilization and coordination of treatment and social services for children prosecuted in adult courts. He retired from the bench in 2008 and became Executive Director of Big Brothers Big Sisters of New York City. He is an alumnus of St. John's University School of Law. He is an author and lecturer. Honors include The New York Foundling's Lifetime Achievement Award, Advocate of the Decade, The Eleanor Roosevelt Award, Excellence in Juvenile Justice, Frank Hogan Recognition Award, Excellence in Children's Advocacy Award, and many others.

JUDGE MATHIS

Judge Mathis is currently in its 21st season and has a full docket that engages and excites viewers from coast to coast. Judge Mathis is a national figure known for his advocacy campaigns for equal justice. His inspirational life story of a street youth who rose from jail to Judge has provided hope to millions who watch him on the award-winning television court show, Judge Mathis, each day. In addition, his weekly newspaper column brings social and political insight to readers throughout the country.

Judge Mathis's public service career began in college where he led 'Free South Africa' and voter registration campaigns on campus. After graduating from college in 1983, he joined the staff of Detroit City councilman, Clyde Cleveland. He was the youngest judge in Michigan's history, and served as a Superior Court Judge for Michigan's 36th district. In his efforts to reach out to youth and ex-offenders both in and outside of the courtroom, Judge Mathis opened a community center in his hometown of Detroit and has assisted thousands of youth with his non-profit agency Young Adults Asserting Themselves (Y.A.A.T.), an agency that provides career, business start-up and job opportunities, as well as job training and college enrollment assistance.

In honor of his years of work and commitment to his hometown of Detroit, the city honored Mathis by naming one of the streets, Mathis Avenue, after him. The street is part of a new housing development, which replaced the housing projects he grew up in. Judge Mathis has received numerous awards and keys to the city from government officials and is the recipient of Honorary Doctorates from both Florida A&M University and Eastern Michigan University.

Judge Mathis presides over real, hard-hitting cases and his decisions are legal and binding. His use of the bench to provide resolution and counseling to litigants before him has catapulted Judge Mathis to the forefront of a national dialogue about real issues facing contemporary society. His trademark sense of humor, personal commitment to social and equal justice, and degree of humanity and forthrightness distinguish him from the rest of the genre. His program

provides information on issues including law, crime, education, social and family matters, and resources.

THE PEOPLE'S COURT
MONDAY – FRIDAY 1:00PM TO 2:00PM & 12:00AM TO 1:00AM

The honorable Judge Marilyn Milian returns to celebrate a decade of dockets on the courtroom series that launched the entire court show genre. Milian continues to render verdicts and dispense legal insight in the courtroom where justice and reality collide.

"The People's Court," draws on ordinary people who have filed grievances in civil court and have opted to have their cases heard and mediated by Judge Milian. An experienced team of researchers continually canvas courts across the country in search of the most compelling, unique and thought-provoking cases. Running the gamut from disputes between neighbors and family members, to unsatisfied customers suing businesses, Milian's decisions, based on current law are final and binding. "These cases are never about the money, they're about principle," Milian proclaims. "The People's Court" has been delivering reality television to viewers for over two decades.

Judge Marilyn Milian brings over 19 years of legal experience to the bench. Milian was appointed to the Miami Circuit Court in 1999 by Governor Jeb Bush, where she served in the Criminal Division. Prior to that, she spent five years in the Miami County Court in the Domestic Violence, Criminal and Civil divisions. She was appointed to the County Court by then-governor, Lawton Chiles. Before serving in the County Court, Milian worked for 10 years as an Assistant State Attorney for the Dade County State Attorney's Office, personally hired by Janet Reno.

Judge Milan is honored to be the first Latina Judge to host a nationally syndicated television court show. She often uses pearls of wisdom recalled from her Cuban mother and grandmother when addressing litigants. She is well known for her dedication to the Hispanic community and as strong voice against domestic violence.

Harvey Levin serves as the series' host and legal reporter. In addition to introducing the cases to viewers, Levin literally takes "The People's Court" to the people by polling viewers who watch the cases via monitor. These viewers' spirited comments and debates regarding the cases and Milian's decisions are then incorporated into the show. An attorney and law professor, Levin also examines and explains the legal issues and precedents introduced in the cases.

In-court reporter Doug Llewelyn and court officer Douglas McIntosh, assist Judge Milian in the courtroom. Llewelyn interviews litigants after a decision has been rendered in their cases. As court officer, McIntosh helps Milian in maintaining courtroom order, as well as acting as an intermediary between the Judge and the litigants.

Admiral Brett Giroir, Former HHS Assistant Secretary for Health stated hat people are better off and there is no increased risk of vaccine side effects. With population growth in certain areas of the state, lawmakers proposed four maps in today's meeting. Questions regarding the Voting Rights Act, and if any racial polarization studies were done were questioned. All maps received committee recommendation. The street named Jeff Davis was changed today to Civil Rights Attorney Fred Gray. Fred Gray still practices law in Tuskegee, but grew up on the street during Jim Crow era and went on to represent Martin Luther King Jr. and Rosa Parks. In a poetic and historic ceremony, his name replaced the Confederate President's name. In West Alabama, police arrest a second suspect in the July shooting of Selma Officer Marquise Moorer. Officer Moorer was killed in an ambush style shooting. A 22 year old was arrested by ALEA State Bureau of Investigation. This investigation remains ongoing. New Animal Laws may be coming to Montgomery. The Montgomery City Council approved the City's budget for 2022 and initiated an Office of Violence Prevention. The new office focuses on crime trends and data around the city and uses different measures to help prevent repetitive crimes from happening. Troy University is not requiring vaccinations, as they do not fall under the guidance of President Biden's executive order. Troy still encourages employees to be vaccinated and has free vaccines available at their Troy Campus Health Center. Organizers say it was an effort to reach out to the community and educate people about breast cancer. October is Domestic Violence Month. The Alabama Coalition Against Violence held a balloon release event to elevate the voices of survivors and help others who find themselves in this situation. Crimestoppers requests help regarding an Eclectic bank robbery that occurred at a bank on Kowligia Road and handed a teller a bank note saying he was robbing the bank. If you have information, please call Crimestoppers. Children in Pike County enjoyed an early Halloween treat today during "Town Hall-oween".

11/3/21: Civic Affairs, Resources, Education and Development, Economic Development, Community Events, Crime Prevention and Law Enforcement, Health Issues

Lawmakers discuss an "Opportunity District" as the proposed Congressional Maps for the state are reviewed and redistricting is addressed. Baptist Medical Center East had an open house for its expanded Women's Services Unit. Baptist East is the 3rd highest delivering hospital in the state, delivering nearly 5,000 babies per year. The Ribbon Cutting event included a tour of rooms and floors. Many local businesses are hiring. Once the pandemic hit, many businesses saw worker shortages, including two local businesses Uncle Mick's Cabin and Pamala's Boutique. To survive, we've had to shrink our day and times open, per Mick. The Montgomery County District Attorney's office is holding another 2nd Change Job Fair. The fair is designed to connect ex-offenders and businesses who want to give them an opportunity at employment. Over 40 businesses will be on hand. Sheriff Mike Granthum made a 4 year old Sheriff for a Day. Ashton Brown of Selma is fascinated with law enforcement, and wanted to be a sheriff for Halloween, but was admitted into ICU. Granthum treated the child to a day at the Sheriff's office, provided a uniform and a ride in a squad car. The battle over vaccine mandates is heating up at Capital Hill. More than 3 dozen Senate Republicans say they will use the Congressional Review Act to challenge President Biden's Vaccine Mandate for private employers. A vaccine mandate for federal contractors will take effect next month.

11/5/21: Civic Affairs, Public Safety, Education and Development, Volunteer Opportunities, Programs and Efforts, Community Events, Economic Development

The Alabama Legislature passed a bill that would prevent children under 9 to receive a coronavirus vaccine without the parent's consent. Montgomery Fire and Rescue investigates a fire that resulted in a house burning to the ground. No one was injured. Career Day with a Twist was held at Catoma Elementary. Vehicles from different occupations come with staff to speak to children about their professions. There was a lot of vehicles and gives children a different look at careers to become great citizens. Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity held a groundbreaking for their new facility geared towards mentoring young men of Montgomery. The new facility will have a tutoring area and computer lab. Donations and mentors are requested. The Montgomery Sheriff's Department hosted an annual toy drive and request donations. Greenville High School students work at the "Thirsty Tiger" to teach how to run a register, make coffee, and stock supplies. The goal of the program is to teach skills for life. Selma is hosting a photography festival this weekend showcasing the work of dozens of photographers from across the country. Photographic Nights of Selma featured photographers from Los Angeles, France, Hawaii, Montreal, and other locations. The goal is an international event that will bring more people to Selma and impact the local economy. The push for a vote on President Biden's Build Back Better initiative was kept by House Democratic leadership. Moderates are withholding support, which could take weeks as they complete a due diligence.

11/24/21: Crime Prevention and Law Enforcement, Health Issues, Community Events, Civil Rights History

The former Mayor of Mosses has been charged with rape. According to the Attorney General's Office he is charged with raping a 12 year old girl. He was on probation from using more than \$25,000 of

town money to pay personal bills or put in his personal checking account. He'll be going back to prison to serve the rest of his five year sentence on this conviction. Alabama prisons are updating policies now that Covid 19 cases are going down. Two visitors can see an inmate, with visits limited to one hour. Ten percent of inmates will be randomly given a rapid Covid test each week. Twenty percent of inmates on work release will have a rapid test each month. Guidelines on masks and social distancing and sanitation will be followed. Martha's Place distributed 600 plates of food thanks to NFL player Hamilton. Sherilyn Reynolds talked about growth and the impact on Montgomery. A new book, Mt. Zion, takes a closer look at one of Montgomery's historical churches and the once thriving Westside community it served and continues to serve. C.P. Everett reminisces on his West Montgomery home and the Mt. Zion AME Church, which was widely known as a meeting spot. His book celebrates the history and journey of the church from 1866 to 1956. It also traces the evolution of the Peacock Trace Community, from a 100 acre plantation to a civil rights beacon. All proceeds from book sales go to the restoration of the original building and church mission.

11/25/21: Volunteer Opportunities, Programs and Efforts, Crime Prevention and Law Enforcement, Resources

The Salvation Army hands out free meals to homeless. About 150 meals were handed out to allow guests a free traditional Thanksgiving lunch. Captain Roberts expressed how important it is to act on the Salvation Army's purpose to meet human needs without discrimination. Marth McKinny is an employee who is proud to be able to help so many people volunteering to help the homeless. Additionally, 150 meals were provided from their mobile canteen. A crime wave of smash and grab robberies hits stores across America.

12/2/21: Crime Prevention and Law Enforcement, Economic Development, Community Events, Civic Affairs, Health Issues

Two deputies shot and one killed in Wilcox County. 78 year old Madison Nicholson was long-time Wilcox County constable and also a process server. He was hit while responding to a domestic disturbance call in Yellow Bluff. Domestic calls can be the most dangerous calls per Sheriff Earnest Evans. The flag at the courthouse annex in Camden is at half staff and black ribbons have been hung at the doors to honor the fallen officer. Crimestoppers is asking for help to locate William Dicks Jr. for theft of property from Lowe's and Sam's Club. Montgomery's Whitewater is closer to a reality. Construction began in the first week of June and officials say the project is on schedule. Montgomery Whitewater will have walking, hiking, ziplines, restaurants, and an amphitheater. There is upwards of 40% minority business inclusion in the project. Gov. Ivey will light the official state Christmas Tree tomorrow, along with a number of other local happenings. Hopes that a government shut down can be avoided before the late Friday night deadline is floated by some Congressional Lawmakers. President Biden's strategy to fight off the omicron variant includes tighter testing timelines for travelers, along with mask mandates and more home testing. He states the new variant is a cause for concern but not panic.

12/3/21: Crime Prevention and Law Enforcement, Resources, Health Issues, Economic Development

Three Southside High School students are arrested for three fully loaded guns and marijuana at the school. Dallas County Sheriff's Office Mike Granthum says his office was alerted by an anonymous tip that a student may have a gun at school. The campus was placed on lockdown for an hour. The person that called in the tip is a hero in my mind. Sheriff Granthum says that we don't know how many lives were saved today. There was in excess of 40 to 45 rounds easily and no telling the damage that could have been done. MPS says they will administer voluntary weekly covid tests in elementary schools in conjunction with UAB. Testing is voluntary and with parent signed permission slips. MPS Head Nurse, Dorothy Jones, says she is hopeful that parents will sign to keep all students safe. Dr. Moore says MPS wants to bring testing to all of their schools. Shoe Station has been bought by Shoe Carnival, including the Montgomery location. Show Station is one of the national largest independent

show retailers, with 21 locations in five Southeastern states.
12/09/21: Civic Affairs, Volunteer Opportunities, and Efforts, Law Enforcement and Crime Prevention, Resources, Community Events
Bob Dole is lying in state today at the US Capital. His funeral is Friday morning. He was a former Presidential candidate, World War Two Hero, and Senator. The Red Kettle Campaign needs volunteers. The Montgomery Salvation Army is in desperate need of volunteers as they have 40 kettles but can only fill 11 spots. Fundraising goals are in jeopardy, with only two weeks to go. Money from the campaign is used to service community members that need a little extra help. The Salvation Army in Selma is similarly short of volunteers and donations of clothes and food to meet emergency needs. Civic leaders delivered Montgomery Area Council on Aging (MACOA) holiday bags to local seniors. Almost 500 bags filled with non-perishable food and gifts. MACOA has over 1,000 volunteers who help all throughout the year. A gun was found at Goodwyn Middle School in Montgomery, and another at Lee High School. A faculty member at Lee learned of the possibility that a student may have gun and informed security personnel, who searched for the weapon. It was confiscated and the student taken into custody. District Attorney Michael Jackson says the Selma murder trial of Courtney Williams witness testimony wrapped up today. The noble art of chess was on display at Pike Road Elementary. Jonathan Rasberry is the chess coach for several of the schools in attendance and help put on the event. Chess helps people think critically, helps them calculate, and make decisions without emotion. Chess also helps with socializing because you meet new friends.
12/10/21: Crime Prevention and Law Enforcement, Public Safety, Economic Development, Resources, Education and Development, Civil Rights History, Volunteer Opportunities, Programs and Events
Montgomery County Sheriff Derrick Cunningham discusses how to keep school campuses safe. Montgomery violence includes 320 shootings this year. 73 of these were homicides, which is 5 more murders than last year with three weeks to go. St. James Hotel in Selma has seen a successful year. GM Cynthia Rudolph says word is out about the historical hotel and occupancy is up and climbing. The historic hotel offers a courtyard and full service restaurant. It offers a chance to experience history and is one of the only surviving antebellum hotels in the Southeast. That's My Child celebrates 9 years in Montgomery. Founder Charles Lee started the organization as a way to give back to the community by taking at-risk youth and developing their skills and talent and giving them employment. More than 1,000 teenagers have gone through the program since its 2012 beginning. John Lewis will be honored with a bobblehead. The item features John Lewis standing on the historic Edmond Pettus Bridge. The National Bobblehead Hall of Fame and Museum is donating 10% of the profits to the National Civil Rights Museum in Memphis, Tennessee. The Edmonite Missions in Selma is hosting a drive through Christmas Toy Giveaway. Gifts for up to 18 years and lunch for everyone will be provided. This give away is to make sure every child has a present under the tree for Christmas. And to bring a little joy into the day to make that celebration like everyone else's celebration.
12/12/21: Crime Prevention and Law Enforcement, Health Issues
The Marion Bank has been broken into and as result thousands of dollars of damage done. No money was taken and the whole thing was caught on surveillance. Federal health officials are putting a big focus on the omicron variant. It is now in at least 22 states and researchers say it is the most contagious variant we've seen so far. The FDA authorized additional doses of Pfizer's vaccine for teenagers 16 and older, saying there are no major safety concerns.
12/13/21: Crime Prevention and Law Enforcement, Public Safety, Volunteer Opportunities, Programs and Events
One person killed at Gunter Annex and an investigation is underway. Two security personnel and two visiting civilians were taken to a local hospital for treatment of injuries. However, one of the civilian's injuries proved fatal. FBI and AFOSI are currently investigating. Residents at Linden Apartment

Complex report a persistent mold problem and express concern for their health and safety. Vicky Keller says she is concerned for her grandson. She cleans the mold, but within a day it has grown back up. Residents speak up in hopes that someone hears their cries. Montgomery District Attorney's Office went on a caroling tour making 3 stops around Montgomery. They stopped at the Children's Center of Montgomery, serving children with disabilities. Stops two and three were to nursing homes, Diversicare of Montgomery and Montgomery Health and Rehab. The DA's office hopes to show their heart for the community outside of the courtroom. The Governor's Mansion Christmas tours resume for the season and guests were surprised to see Governor Ivey today. The mansion has served as the official residence for governors of Alabama since 1951.

12/16/21: Civil Rights History, Crime Prevention and Law Enforcement, Health Issues, Community Events, Economic Development, Volunteer Opportunities, Programs and Efforts, Civic Affairs

Civil Rights Pioneer Claudette Colvin's juvenile record was expunged by a Montgomery County District Judge last month. She was just 15 years old when she refused to give up her seat to a white woman, 66 years ago in Montgomery. Nine months before Rosa Parks would be arrested for doing the same. Her attorney was Fred Gray, who also represented Rosa Parks in what would spark the Montgomery Bus Boycott. Colvin's bravery sparked the urge for a demand for justice. ALEA delivered Trooper Bears to children who may spend Christmas in the hospital. In Montgomery, they delivered bears to kids at Baptist Medical Center East. Troopers say they get as much out of the quick visits as the children who receive the bears. Montgomery has confirmed its first case of Omicron. State Health Officer Scott Harris cautioned that scientists are still learning about the variant and urged Alabamians to get vaccinated and to get a booster. The HBCU Pigskin Showdown is this Sunday at the Marion Military Institute. Montgomery Airport Authority names new Executive Director, Wade Davis. He has significant experience in transportation and operations management. Max for Kids was founded in 2001 by Max Employees as a way to give back in the River Region. Pike Road School System is growing at such a quick pace, there are already plans to build a new high school. Pike Road officials expects commerce to grow and residential areas development.

12/23/21: Community Events, Crime Prevention and Law Enforcement, Resources, Health Issues

Councilwoman Audrey Graham provided an opportunity for residents to keep part of the district 4 clean. They are seeing improvements. She started the program because dumping trash and leaving large items such as furniture was making the district look less appealing. Sometimes when I ride Mobile Highway, she states, she rides slow so she can see trails of cleanliness. We are making a difference and I am excited. Montgomery police have arrested a man charged with arson of his own home. First United Methodist Church in Montgomery is holding in person Christmas Eve worship services with communion. A Union Town exercise program has seniors focusing on their best lives by encouraging them to stay physically active. The physical activity for life program encourages African American senior citizens in the Black Belt to engage in physical activity. They work on mobility, flexibility, endurance and strength. Personal Trainer Karla McCoy recently came to meet the ladies. The group of seniors plan to continue to meet after the program ends.

12/30/21: Health Issues, Community Events, Volunteer Opportunities, Programs and Efforts

Auburn University reinstates its mask mandate in the wake of rising Covid cases. Hospitals and doctors are overwhelmed as coronavirus reaches record levels. Here in Alabama, state health officials say all 67 counties are considered "high risk" of spreading the virus. About 31% of tests are coming back positive. Eastdale Mall is hosting a New Year's Eve balloon drop with thousands of balloons. There will be free ice skating and store giveaways. Wetumpka will host it's "meteor strike" at midnight to commemorate the actual meteor that hit the area 80 million years ago. Montgomery also invites you to a celebration event with music and fireworks. The Life South Blood mobile says that donations drop during the holidays and supplies are low. Selma Walmart hosts a blood drive with prizes for donors.

ABA – ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES
