First Quarter 2022

1. **WEATHER** - Emergency crews responded to a water rescue in Union County Saturday morning after a pontoon overturned in heavy rains. Uniontown Water Rescue said the accident happened by Slim Island. (1/1) Cleanup efforts have resumed in Muhlenberg County's Bremen, Kentucky, after a brief pause on those efforts over the holiday season (1/04) Several organizations in Daviess County, Kentucky, area preparing to offer shelter from the cold to those in need. The Daviess County Emergency Management Agency says that a White Flag event will begin on Wednesday night and run through at least Monday night (1/5) The Indiana Department of Transportation sent out crews Wednesday in preparation for snow and the possibility of ice on the roads on Thursday (1/6) Ice and heavy snow can bring trees and power lines to the ground, so power companies are preparing for the winter weather approaching (1/31) With that Winter Storm Watch extending across a majority of the Tri-State, homeowners are bracing for power outages and frozen pipes (2/1) Indiana State Police are reporting several incidents as of Thursday morning due to the winter weather; Thousands of people around the Tri-State area experienced power outages on Thursday due to damaging winter weather that hit the area (2/3) Kentuckians impacted by the tornadoes and storms that hit the state in December of 2021 will now have until mid-March to apply for federal assistance (2/10) EMA directors from across western Kentucky stopped by Dawson Springs Monday to talk about how to be weather prepared (3/1) The latest model data indicates that the first of our snow chances will reach our westernmost communities shortly after our lunch hour on Friday (3/10) For NWS Paducah, the idea of "Tornado Alley" is subjective. For some, it could mean a zone farther west in the Plains States, for others it could be an area a lot closer to the Tri-State (3/23)
2. **EDUCATION** - Former University of Evansville Men's Basketball Coach Walter McCarty has filed a lawsuit against the University for thousands of dollars. The lawsuit filed against the University in late-December claims it breached its agreement with McCarty by not paying him for services during his employment from 2018 to 2020. McCarty was fired back in January of 2020 after being accused of violating the University's Title IX policy (1/3) Education officials with the Evansville Vanderburgh School Corporation have released a statement on the district's plans in regard to Thursday's snowy weather. The EVSC says that schools will **not** be dismissing students early but all after-school and evening activities for Thursday would be canceled (1/6) A junior high student in Mt. Carmel, Illinois, is facing several felony charges after threats were made over social media. (1/7) Eight of the 18 schools in the Warrick County School Corporation will temporarily require masks starting on Monday, Jan. 10. (1/8) School Closings; Kentucky's governor unveiled a \$2 billion education investment plan on Monday that proposes raises for all school staff, universal preschool for all four-year-olds, full-day kindergarten for every Kentucky child, and more; For the rest of this week the halls of Mt. Carmel High School will appear empty, after Superintendent, Dr. Chuck Bleyer, made the decision to return to remote learning due to staffing issues (1/10) The Evansville Vanderburgh School Corporation has announced a new incentive for substitute teachers working to support the district through the coronavirus pandemic, offering \$40 per-day additional pay to substitute teachers as both an incentive and a "thank you"; Vincennes University says it's making a temporary switch to virtual learning due to the rising number of COVID-19 cases. (1/14) Daviess County Public Schools will be virtual Tuesday due to the high amount of Covid-19 cases. (1/17) The Metropolitan School District of Mt. Vernon on Monday will be making a temporary switch to virtual learning due to the rapid spread of COVID-19 within schools (1/21) The Warrick County School Corp. has extended their mask policy and are now accepting Covid- 19 rapid tests (1/24) The Indiana House has passed a bill requiring schools to post curriculum online. It adds the curriculum

also has to be approved of a committee made up of 60% parents, and 40% of educators (1/27) School Districts around the Tri-State are monitoring the incoming weather conditions. Here locally, the Evansville Vanderburgh School Corporation is still looking to fill empty positions; USI announced it will join the Ohio Valley Conference for the upcoming 2022-2023 school year as part of the move to Division I (2/9) Masks will be optional for all students and staff in the Owensboro Public Schools district as of Monday (2/11) A group of Evansville teachers traveled to Indianapolis Monday to join other educators lobbying against a controversial education bill. (2/15) EVSC has made the decision to become mask optional for all students, faculty, and staff. The policy will go into effect Wednesday (2/16) The Henderson County Schools district says it's removing its mask requirement for students and staff; New guidance from the state of Indiana says students who have been exposed to a positive COVID-19 case no longer need to quarantine, regardless of vaccination status or whether or not the school requires masks (2/17) A controversial education bill was struck down in the Senate on Monday after Hoosier educators expressed their concerns at the Indiana Capitol (3/1) All students at Owensboro High School were dismissed early Wednesday after a bomb threat was made around 11:40 a.m., according to district officials (3/10) Just one day after a bomb threat was made on Wednesday, officials say another bomb threat was made at Owensboro High School, After receiving bomb threats two days in a row, officials with Owensboro High School say extra safety measures will be in place on Friday; The University of Evansville announced Friday that Athletic Director Mark Spencer's is stepping down. The announcement comes after Spencer met with UE President Christopher Pietruszkiewicz. A national search will commence immediately (3/11) A male juvenile has been arrested for making terroristic threats against Apollo High School (3/14)

3. **TRAFFIC** - Several emergency agencies responded to a late-night crash in Gibson County a few miles east of Highway 41 between Princeton and Ft. Branch on New Year's Eve. (1/1) A 47-year-old Shawneetown woman is dead after a car crash in White County on New Year's Day. The preliminary investigative shows Keely Wright tried to pass another car when it hydroplaned and left the south side of the roadway (1/3) The Evansville Police Department is asking for the public's help identifying a vehicle involved in a recent hit-and-run. Police say it happened at the intersection of John Street and Main Street and that a person was hit by the car before its driver left the scene (1/04) Thursdays winter storms covered roadways across our tri-state, causing dangerous driving conditions for all on the road that led to numerous collisions and slide-offs. This winter storm made for a busy day for law enforcement and dispatch across our tri-state with over 400 calls received. (1/8) Salt trucks started pre-treating roads throughout the tri-state Wednesday in preparation for snow expected this weekend. (1/14) Monday, ISP cited one man for driving 100 miles per hour on Interstate 69 in Pike County, leading Troopers to stress the dangers of speeding in icy conditions. (1/18) The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers says the lock chambers at the Newburgh Locks and Dam are currently closed to water traffic after a navigation accident that happened early Tuesday morning (2/8) Drivers in northern Vanderburgh County are being advised of a road closure caused by a fallen tree (2/17) One person is dead and two others injured after a crash that happened on Highway 41 Wednesday in Princeton, Indiana (2/23) American Airlines has paused its flights from the Evansville Regional Airport to Chicago due to several factors including pilot shortages (3/1) According to Evansville first responders, a passing CSX train spotted the sinking car just off Ohio Street near Pigeon Creek (3/04) One of two pedestrians who were hit by a car while crossing the Lloyd Expressway in Evansville on Tuesday night has died from their injuries and been identified as a 19-year-old girl (3/16) Gibson County Traffic Safety Partnership will step up patrols for stop-arm violations, speeding, and other forms of reckless driving around school buses over next few weeks (3/23) The Gibson County Sheriff's Office says the northbound lanes of Interstate 69 near the Mackey exit are currently closed due to multiple fires in the area (3/28)
4. **COVID** - While it's been nearly two years since the Hoosier State saw its first positive case of COVID-19, the state health department reported Indiana's highest-ever day of new positive cases on Thursday, Dec. 30, 2021, with 12,020 new cases of the virus identified statewide (1/3) The Omicron variant is dominating the positive cases of Covid-19 in the Tri-State, making the need for testing hard to come by as the virus spreads (1/04) National Guard members spent months on the frontline with the medical staff at Deaconess Midtown in Evansville and Gateway Hospital in Newburgh, now they are walking away after helping hundreds and

even thousands of patients in need (1/5) Tuesday, Deaconess reported 126 COVID-Positive patients who are hospitalized, 46 in the ICU, and 26 patients on the ventilators. (1/6) The Indiana State Department of Health's daily COVID-19 update Wednesday showed 656 new positive cases of COVID-19 in Vanderburgh County. The record-breaking day of new positive cases in the county surpassed the previous one-day record of 534 new positive cases, which was set just eight days earlier on Jan. 4 (1/12) As case counts surge with the spread of Omicron, the rapid tests are a quick and easy way to know whether you're positive or negative, and while they're convenient, local health leaders said there's one notable problem. Because the store-bought tests are never sent to a lab, those results are not being reported; Owensboro Health Regional Hospital is postponing some surgeries due to the high number of COVID-19 patients it's currently treating (1/13) The Indiana State Department of Health says there were 704 new positive cases of COVID-19 identified in the county on Friday, breaking the county's record for the third day in a row . (1/14) On Friday, the Community Patient Safety Coalition stated that local hospitals in the area are decreasing visitation effective January 17th (1/17) All 92 counties in Indiana are now listed as 'Red' on the state health department's COVID-19 County Metrics Map, indicating a high spread of the virus in every county throughout the state (1/19) Another record breaking day in Vanderburgh County as almost 800 new positive cases of the virus were reported in the county on Thursday (1/20) Posey County Sheriff Tom Latham said Friday that the jail was currently dealing with 25 positive COVID-19 cases among inmates/detainees (1/21) The number of people getting both the coronavirus and the flu at the same time is on the rise (1/25) State health officials are reporting a high number of new positive COVID-19 cases in our area with Vanderburgh County announcing 858 new cases on Thursday (1/28) The Henderson County Schools district says it's making some changes to its "Test to Stay" program, accepting at-home test results (2/4) The Green River District Health Department is reporting another 506 new positive cases of COVID-19 in its seven-county area since Friday. Meanwhile, the Indiana State Department of Health reported 4 new COVID-19 deaths in Vanderburgh County. 5. **SHOTS FIRED** - Monday evening family, friends and fellow officers came out to mourn fallen Wayne County Sheriff Deputy, Sean Riley. Last Wednesday Deputy Riley was shot and killed while in line of duty when he responded to a motorist assist call. (1/04) New charges have been filed against the man accused of shooting and killing a Wayne County, Illinois sheriff's deputy. Officials in St. Charles County, Missouri, filed 14 new charges against 40-year-old Ray Tate in connection to a string of incidents that took place on Dec. 29 - the day that Wayne County Sheriff's Deputy Sean Riley was shot and killed (1/5) The Owensboro Police Department says it's investigating after two juveniles were shot in different areas of the city on Tuesday (1/6) The Evansville Police Department is investigating an explosion they say took place Saturday night that was caused by a firework that malfunctioned (1/10) One person was sent to the hospital after a Friday morning shooting in Evansville. Officers with the Evansville Police Department responded to the America's Best Value Inn off of S. Green River Road on Friday morning after a shooting was reported around 1:00 a.m. (1/14) Officers are investigating a shooting that took place in Evansville Sunday night after a house was hit by gunfire. (1/17) An attempted break-in that happened at an apartment complex in Evansville on Sunday ended with one man being shot, according to police (1/24) A murder investigation is underway in Owensboro, Kentucky, after a woman was killed and two others were injured in a shooting that happened Wednesday, according to police (1/27) A man was shot and killed during a hostage situation in Evansville on Friday, according to police (2/4) The hostage suspect involved in a fatal Evansville Police Department shooting has been identified as 34-year-old Phillip Dill (2/5) The victim of a shooting that happened on Sunday night on Madison Avenue in Evansville has died from their injuries, according to police (2/7) For the second time in two days, a neighborhood on Evansville's south side is on alert after bullets rang out last night (2/10) A 70 year-old man has been arrested after police say he shot his son in the stomach Saturday night (2/21) A standoff at an Evansville apartment complex came to an end on Thursday morning after it began almost 12 hours ago with an exchange of gunfire between police and a suspect (3/24) Gun violence is rising in Vanderburgh County. It has been for the past few years. And with that climb, the Sheriff's Office has now added an armored Bearcat vehicle. (3/29)

Police took a report from a pregnant woman working at the Long John Silver's restaurant at Boeke and Morgan after she said she was kicked in the stomach by a customer who became angry over hush puppies (1/6) The Evansville Police Department is looking for a man they say dragged a woman down a flight of stairs at her apartment building, after making threats against her and her dog's life (1/24) An investigation into a report of an assault involving an off-duty Muhlenberg County deputy has resulted in several criminal charges, according to the Kentucky State Police (1/28) A Warrick County man is recovering from a shooting that took place early Thursday morning in Henderson County after a violent carjacking (2/11) The Evansville Police Department has worked 122 domestic violence battery reports since January 1st (2/14) Police say an 18-year-old was arrested for assault on Wednesday after heating up a piece of metal during shop class at Henderson County High School and asking another student to hold it, causing them to burn their hand (2/17) A Madisonville man was arrested following an investigation into a sex abuse case (2/18) A Warrick County Sheriff's Deputy has been arrested and is facing charges stemming from an incident at a bar over the summer; Parents and students continue to react after a fight broke out at the Harrison and Bosse basketball game Friday night. 7. **FRAUD** - The Evansville Police Department is searching for a man who tried to pass off counterfeit bills at a local gentlemen's club on Saturday night (1/10) The owners of an Evansville restaurant have entered guilty pleas on several federal charges. Kent Dam and Gracie's Chinese Cuisine, Inc. are listed as defendants in the case charging Transporting and Harboring Aliens, Money Laundering, and Unlawful Employment of Aliens between 2017 and 2021 (1/12) The Vanderburgh County Sheriff's Office says phone scammers posing as deputies are making calls and threatening potential victims by telling them there's a warrant out for their arrest (1/20) A Hopkins County pastor was arrested on several charges after being accused of stealing from a local nonprofit organization (1/24) The Vanderburgh County Prosecutor's Office said Wednesday that Christopher Leduc, who formerly served as the county's deputy coroner, had pleaded guilty to charges of Theft and Official Misconduct. 8. **CHILD ENDANGERMENT** - Owensboro Police continue searching for Alina Bartolon. Alina was last seen on Christmas Eve. She spent the evening with her father. They attended a Christmas Eve church service and got dinner before returning home (1/11) A 29-year-old Evansville man is facing several charges including neglect and DUI after an incident that happened on Tuesday evening. The 911 caller for that crash said that a blue car with two kids inside it had crashed. They said that one of the kids wasn't in a child restraint and that one of them had a busted lip (1/12) The Owensboro 14-year-old that has been missing since Christmas Eve has been located and a Colorado man is taken into custody in the case. 9. **ELECTION 2022** - A Republican candidate for the next sheriff of Vanderburgh County filed his election paperwork on Wednesday morning. Jeff Hales filed for Vanderburgh County Sheriff on Wednesday morning inside the Evansville Civic Center (1/12) On Wednesday, Vanderburgh County Clerk Carla Hayden announced a change to the list of Election Day vote centers (3/24)
10. **TAXES/LEGISLATION** - Used and new vehicles have become more valuable during the pandemic, but that increase in value will also be affecting the vehicles tax bill; The Indiana House approved a bill on Tuesday that would repeal the law that requires a person to obtain a license to carry a handgun in the state of Indiana (1/13) The filing of legislation in Illinois to reinstate the death penalty for killing a police officer follows the murder of Wayne County Deputy Sean Riley, who was shot and killed while responding to a motorist assist on Interstate 64 back in December (1/26) The nursing shortage will not fix itself. That's the idea behind a new proposal in Indiana to bridge the gap when it comes to properly staffing hospitals. 12. **EMPLOYMENT** - Tyson Foods officials say a shift in production to meet the needs of customers is behind layoff of 200 employees at the plant in Henderson County's Robards, Kentucky (1/20)
13. **DEPUTY HICKS** – Posey County Deputy Bryan Hicks was shot in September 2021 when he responded to a welfare check in New Harmony. On Saturday, he returned home to Posey County after months of treatment for the injuries he sustained. (1/24) Deputy Bryan Hicks made his first public appearance over the weekend. Hicks and his wife were at the semi-annual regular season showdown between Reitz and Central Friday. (1/31)
14. **SAVE JAGER** – The dog that has been in the middle of a legal battle in Mt. Vernon over the past year has now been stolen, according to Mayor G. William Curtis. Jager, a pit bull-boxer mix, was stolen following the

Indiana Supreme Court refused to overturn the order to destroy the animal. (1/24)

15. **DRUGS** – An Evansville man was arrested on Monday after police say they discovered 175 grams of methamphetamine during a traffic stop (1/25) Pennyriale Narcotics task force Detectives, Henderson Sheriff Deputies and Providence Police Officers have been conducting a 2-month long illegal drug and narcotics investigation that resulted in a series of arrests over the weekend. (1/31) Three people have been indicted on drug charges in connection to several fentanyl investigations out of Henderson County, Kentucky, the Department of Justice announced Monday (2/15) Two people were arrested in Hopkins County on Thursday after police say they found possible fentanyl pills and an AK-74 style rifle in a home where kids were living; An Evansville man is facing multiple drug-related charges after the Indiana State Police says troopers found a gun, a large amount of marijuana, and a large amount of cash in his possession (2/26) Authorities in Hopkins County say a 21-year-old Madisonville man has been arrested and charged with Murder in connection to the fatal fentanyl overdose of a 15-year-old girl; A Henderson man is facing multiple drug trafficking charges after investigators say he was selling and using drugs that he was bringing into a local business (3/4) Four people, including an elementary school teacher, were arrested in Union County, Kentucky on Friday as the result of an ongoing drug investigation, according to the Union County Sheriff's Office (3/7) A contract employee who was working as an EMT at the Henderson County Detention Center was arrested on charges of drug trafficking and promoting contraband after authorities say she gave suboxone to two inmates at the jail.
