SUBJECT: Heroin Issue

DISCUSSION: Heroin is a growing issue in our region and around the country. In July of last year it was noticed that there was an increase in the number of suspected heroin overdoses in Allegany County. Through assistance of the State Medical Examiner's office and the Maryland Police Crime Lab the Police were able to link the overdoses to the drug fentanyl. The Drug enforcement administration tells us that fentanyl laced Heroin were seeing in Allegany County presently is not a regulated drug. In fact it's being produced in mass quantities in labs in Mexico and overseas. Selling price for a kilo or two 2.2 pounds is \$2500 to put this in perspective Heroin sells for \$85,000 a kilo. Pure fentanyl is 40-50 times stronger than street level heroin. It takes only a few graduals the size of salt grains to cause death. By December of last year the police were realizing the overwhelming scope of this problem. There has been 22 heroin overdoses in Allegany County in just one month three of which were fatal. Proceeding 11 months of last year there were 8 opium overdoses only two of which were fatal. But between December and today in less than seven months 152 of opium drugs have occurred in Allegany County and 23 have been fatal. This is an enormous problem and to stop it and get a hold of it has to be partnership. There has to be education, prevention, and obviously enforcement. So what the police is doing right now is trying to get the word out they have seen an increase in almost all crime in Allegany County and in Cumberland and the majority their seeing it in is basic crimes like robberies people steal to support their habit. All the officers of the Cumberland Police Department, their allied agencies as well were all trained in the administration of naloxone. They have applied for Governors Office of Crime Control and Prevention grant for heroin coordinator it's a position the governor supported addressing this heroin epidemic across the state. It's the opportunity to focus on this problem. Because the heroin problem is causing this problem of other crimes as well in the area and it need to be stopped. The heroin epidemic is rising and needs to be stopped

If you can't attend and want your questions answered you can call the Allegany County Health Department, there is also information on their website, face book page, and the centers for disease control and prevention has a number of resources on their website. The main concern is the mosquitoes that carry zika. There are two types that carry zika and their both in the Aedes family. Their called aedes aegypti and aedes albopictus and both those mosquitoes are in Western Maryland. To protect yourself this summer your encouraged to use bug repellent when your outside and eliminate small pools of water the mosquitoes are attracted to them so also get rid of flower pots, your kids toys that are left outside, an old tire. Those are all places they love and are most likely to lay their eggs so you want to dump out any standing water in your yard or around your home. Also reconsider traveling to some of these areas where there are a large number of Zika cases especially if you're pregnant or thinking about becoming pregnant. Everyone is encouraged to attend this informative meeting to learn how to stay safe and protect themselves and their loved ones from Zika.

It meets once a month, on the first Monday of every month at 5:30pm for an hour in one of the Western Maryland Health System auditoriums across from the cafeteria in the medical center. This is an important because there are so many couples and women in our community dealing with this issue every day. Across the United States 1 in 8 couples experience some form of infertility. So it's very common but something that's not talked about so no one realizes how common it is. Or until you start going through it personally and then you talk with others and realize that person has been through it in the past they have just never opened up about it. When you're going through something your eyes are opened and you start seeing how common it is. This support group is great because people can talk about a wide range of infertility that they're dealing with. Everyone's situation is different; there are so many different causes that lead to fertility issues and difficulty conceiving. Some people have thyroid disease or polycystic ovarian syndrome, obesity, endometriosis, or even history of cancer can cause infertility. So this program is essential to show how common this problem it is and offer support to those dealing with it.
