"IT HELPS WITH REGROWTH IN THE FOLLOWING SPRING, AND IT ALSO HELPS TO CONTROL SOME OF THE SPECIES WE DON'T WANT TO SEE OCCURRING IN UNITS LIKE THIS."

ARGWEYLO SAYS ONE OF THOSE SPECIES IS THIS, A DOUGLAS FIR, NATIVE TO NORTHERN CALIFORNIA BUT WHEN FULL GROWN CAN WIPE OUT IT'S SURROUNDING NEIGHBORS, LIKE THE OAK TREE.

"BY USING FIRE, WE'RE ABLE TO CAUSE A MORTALITY TO THOSE WOODY SPECIES. IT HELPS MAINTAIN THESE OPEN GRASSLANDS IN AN OPENED LANDSCAPE"

AND WITHOUT CONTROLLED BURNS, HE SAYS
THE CONSEQUENCES COULD BE
DEVASTATING.

"YOU WOULD LOSE THESE GRASSLANDS
ENTIRELY, THEY WOULD CONVERT TO A
FOREST. WE HAVE SEEN ALREADY ANYWHERE
FROM THIRTY TO FORTY PERCENT IN
REDUCTION IN THE EXTENT OF THESE
GRASSLANDS SINCE 1850."

felt any lump, I never felt anything. Breast Cancer was not going to happen to me. ... best thing that ever happened to me."

SHE THEN WENT IN FOR A PARTIAL MASTECTOMY DOCTORS REMOVED SOME LYMPH NODES AND SHE BEGAN RADIATION. HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS TOLD HER SHE SHOULD SHARE HER STORY, SO SHE STARTED SPEAKING AT A LOCAL LEVEL, THEN A NATIONAL LEVEL.

SHE WAS CHOSEN TO BE A NATIONAL PINK TOGETHER AMBASSADOR.

"Part of Pink Together, they were able to partner with Martina McBride, at the time, she had a new album coming out... she had a song on here CD about breast cancer called "I'm gonna love you through it" ...and I was asked to be the ambassador to go on a week long train tour with her, which was 11 cities, it was very exciting."

EDUCATE PEOPLE ABOUT CANCER.

"Before we had the system we had no way to contact a large number of people in one area unless you went out there with a bullhorn or something like that,"

"For the code red system, police first pinpoint the area where they want to send the message, record the message, send it out and they say that the process can sometimes take as little as five minutes,"

"In several situations that I'm aware of over the last few years we have been successful with the public. They call up and say, "hey, I just saw that person at this location just a few minutes ago," and we'll go out there and locate the person,"

"If you're pregnant and you do wish to consume nuts, our data indicates that it's be safe to do so, and it wouldn't lead to any increased risk of a nut allergic baby."

IN FACT, ACCORDING TO THE STUDY DONE AMONG NON-ALLERGIC PREGNANT WOMEN: "THOSE WHO EAT NUTS FIVE TIMES A WEEK OR MORE ARE 31% LESS LIKELY TO SEE ALLERGIES IN THEIR CHILDREN THAN MOTHERS WHO EAT NUTS LESS THAN ONCE A MONTH"

THE AUTHORS DID NOT GO AS FAR AS SAYING EATING NUTS PREVENTS A FOOD ALLERGY. FOR THAT, MORE RESEARCH STILL NEEDS TO BE DONE.

BUT NEW YORK OBGYN DOCTOR JENNIFER WU WELCOMES ANY NEW INSIGHT.

"Mothers are very concerned about the foods that they eat during pregnancy and what it will mean for the child later on. I think peanut allergies are on the rise, and I wish that we knew the exact source of them. We don't-- but um, any thing that we can do to help decrease the incidents is a good thing."

HE SAYS WHILE THE NUMBER OF OFFICERS DYING OF HEART ATTACKS ON THE JOB IS STILL RELATIVELY SMALL, IT'S INCREASING AT AN ALARMING RATE.

10 YEARS AGO THERE WERE ABOUT EIGHT CASES A YEAR. NOW THERE'S AN AVERAGE OF 12. SO WITH 14 DEATHS ALREADY IN 2013, THE AVERAGE IS GETTING HIGHER.

("This is a trouble spot that's got to be addressed. Is it a fitness issue? Is it that officers have a higher rate of obesity, hypertension, smoking and sedentary lifestyle with then a high degree of stress."

ARLINGTON COUNTY POLICE CAPTAIN ADRIENNE QUIGLEY SAYS IT'S THOSE SUDDEN BURSTS OF ACTIVITY THAT HAVE THE BIGGEST IMPACT ON A PERSON'S BODY.

"You may be sitting sedentary for eight hours straight and then you're asked in a split second to get up and sprint as fast you can, and that puts a lot of stress on the body."

CAPTAIN QUIGLEY SAYS HEALTH CONCERNS HAVE PROMPTED ARLINGTON TO ENCOURAGE OFFICERS TO EXERCISE DURING THEIR SHIFTS, UP TO 50 MINUTES A DAY DEPENDING ON STAFFING LEVELS.

BUT KELLY WALSH SAYS LAW ENFORCEMENT NEEDS TO GO ONE STEP FURTHER, WITH BETTER PROGRAMS TO HELP POLICE DEAL WITH MENTAL STRESS, SOMETHING THAT SHE BELIEVES COULD HAVE SAVED HER BROTHER'S LIFE.
