"Because it is in the border area between us and blue lake, they also

dispatched blue lake fire to respond, so blue lake sent an engine, chief officer and a rescue. We sent a chief officer, an engine and a rescue to deal with that incident,"

THE BLUE LAKE FIRE DEPARTMENT ALSO RESPONDED TO THAT INCIDENT BECAUSE OF ITS PROXIMITY TO THE BLUE LAKE JURISDICTION. BUT THERE WAS ONLY ONE ARCATA FIRE DISTRICT ENGINE LEFT IN TOWN, SO HUMBOLDT BAY FIRE ALSO RESPONDED BY SENDING AN ENGINE TO THE INDIANOLA CUTOFF... TO BE READY FOR OTHER EMERGENCY CALLS.

"The next call came in and they upgraded and ask that we respond code 3 to the second call to assist," THAT INCIDENT WAS THE FATAL CRASH AT HIGHWAY 101 AND STATE ROUTE 299.

"Arcata fire district officials say it requires a team effort of all the local jurisdictions to protect the community,"

"It takes quite a few firefighters to deal with large incidents and we know

that we're short staffed, and anything significant, we start calling our neighbors to come help us,"

"At the end of the day, we're all firefighters, we're all here to help regardless of whose community it is,"

"I clarified with dispatch to have another agency start heading to cover because we don't want to burden humboldt bay fire in taking two of their five engines out of their district,"

"When you get behind the wheel of that car, it's very important to be paying attention, that you're not distracted, put that cell phone away, you can get that call later. And by all means, don't drink and drive and to share that message with your family members, your friends,"

Home based is really a wonderful program for a mother  
who's home and can't get her children to school and the

PLEADED TO KEEP THE CENTERS.

"We can't not have that for our kids, I mean, that's where it

begins, it begins in preschool.

AND DESPITE A SCHOOL RALLY AT SMITH RIVER ELEMENTARY, A PETITION WITH OVER 600 SIGNATURES, 5 LETTERS OF SUPPORT AND SEVERAL NEW APPLICATIONS TO INCREASE ENROLLMENT. THE BOARD STILL VOTED TO CLOSE THE SCHOOL...

We need to be fully enrolled within the first 30 days of the program year and then, we need to maintain that, if we're under enrolled over a number of months, we may be considered as an at risk grantee and in danger of losing our program.

NORTHCOAST PRESCHOOLS CAN HAVE 1 TO 3 CLASSES PER CENTER AND THE NCS CLAIMS, EACH CLASS COSTS APPROXIMATELY 100 THOUSAND DOLLARS A YEAR TO OPERATE. A THEY HAD TO MAKE

says many families without homes come  
to motels for shelter but it's a high  
price to pay to get off the streets.  
"it would actually be cheaper to have  
an apartment. i'm paying quite a bit  
right now at \$50 a day. You can find  
places that are cheaper than that. it

would make it a lot easier."

BUT EVEN WITH TWO JOBS.. AFFORDABLE HOUSING IS HARD TO COME BY IN HUMBOLDT COUNTY.. ESPECIALLY A PLACE THAT WILL ACCEPT FIVE PEOPLE.

"It's really upsetting that people judge people because you're in a motel. They think oh they're druggies, that's why they don't have the money to take care of the kids, they don't have a house and that's not always true.

I have a place for them and yes, it is a motel but they have a place to sleep, they're dry they have food, they have everything they need it's just hard to find a place that will rent to us."

ALONG WITH THE LACK OF SPACE AT THE MOTEL.. CHRISTINE SAYS A TINY MICROWAVE AND MINI FRIDGE CAN BE CHALLENGING FOR A FAMILY OF FIVE.

"You don't really realize, until you try to make a meal what you really do have to cook. I mean, you can do a lot of things in the microwave but it's expensive and it's not the healthiest. I try to make it healthy

with salads and fruits."

BUT THE BIGGEST CHALLENGE CHRISTINE SAYS IS TRANSPORTATION.. RELYING ON AN HOURLY BUS SYSTEM TO GET WHERE THEY NEED TO GO.. AND SHE'S NOT ALONE IN THIS STRUGGLE.. TRANSPORTATION DEFICIENCY PLAYS A LARGE ROLE IN KEEPING THE CYCLE OF HOMELESSNESS GOING.

"the number one need that we often see- we the schools.. is transportation. and that is a major stumbling block for students being consistent. So that as they may move from one school district site to another because of lack of housing." AS OF 2010... ONE IN 45 U.S CHILDREN WERE REPORTEDLY HOMELESS.. OR 1.2 MILLION TOTAL.. 300 THOUSAND OF THOSE IN CALIFORNIA ALONE.. A LITTLE OVER ONE HALF OF THEM.. WILL NOT GRADUATE HIGH SCHOOL.. AND SOME ENDING UP IN JAIL

TO THE HOSPITAL. PARAMEDICS ARE AN EXTENSION OF AN E-R DOCTOR AND RESPOND TO EVERYTHING FROM BROKEN BONES TO TRAUMAS OR HEART ATTACKS. "We're dispatched at two levels, code 2 which is basically no lights and sirens and code 3 which is all lights and sirens. We don't really know the nature of the call until we get there. Really just get a brief of what we're going to from dispatch and they have their own system if it's critical or not."

BRANDON HARLANDER HAS BEEN A PARAMEDIC FOR CITY AMBULANCE OF EUREKA FOR 3 YEARS. HE SAYS IT'S A JOB THAT REQUIRES HIM TO WAKE UP IN THE MIDDLE OF THE NIGHT, MAKE QUICK LIFE CHANGING DECISIONS AND WORK AS PART OF A TEAM. "The EMT generally drives us to the call and to the hospital and the paramedic is in the back doing everything. If the ambulance crew needs assistance usually the fire department is there

and they always come with us and help us. We try and work very closely with Humboldt Bay Fire and down in the Fortuna and Garberville areas we work with volunteer agencies." HARLANDER LIVES AT THE STATION TWO OR THREE DAYS A WEEK, WHILE ON DUTY, AND EACH SHIFT IS USUALLY 24 HOURS.

"It's something different every day, I'm independent. I get to be on my own. I love it, it's exciting, it's always different, it's not the same mundane desk job, you know it's something different every day."

Stand up: "The paramedics generally respond in between 2 and 8 calls per night, and they say summer is the busiest season." RONALD FRENCH, AN EMT SAYS WHEN IT COMES TO THE TYPE OF CALLS THEY RECEIVE, THEY HAVE TO BE PREPARED FOR THE UNEXPECTED.

French: "I've been doing this for over 11 years, working in the medical field for 30, but some of the things

that we see there's no way even

"What we always tell people to go to is Ready for Wildfire dot org. There is tremendous amount of information in terms of what to do, its the ready set go program which gives you everything what to do to get ready for a wild fire."

"Now those who think since they live on the coast are protected because the ocean is right at our door step you might want to reconsider those thoughts."

"And so what appears to be green in terms of the vegetation don't be fooled by that it could have a low enough fuel moisture that it could actually spread and the fire could get complex enough that could become a large damaging fire that could threaten lives and property. Yeah don't be lowed into the fact we are on the coast."
