THE ROBINSONS HAVE A PROFITABLE BOOTH LOCATION, BY A BUSY INTERSECTION AND POPULAR SHOPPING MALL. BUT THE UNTHINKABLE HAPPENED AFTER ONLY ONE DAY IN BUSINESS.

"As we pulled up my son said, dad did you remember to lock the container last night and I said, yeah. With the cable also. I said yeah why are you asking.. he said nothing locked.. all of the sudden I felt that sinking feeling in the pit of my stomach.. oh no this can't be happening... walked up and sure enough the doors are ajar and there's a card from the Arcata police.. they had been here."

"The police were called for a burglary in progress to the conex

box that was holding the fireworks we responded in about four minutes and the suspects were already gone."

THE SUSPECTS CUT THREE BOLT LOCKS AND A CABLE LOCK.. THEN ESCAPED WITH A VEHICLE FULL OF FIREWORKS.

"I was really discouraged and shocked and just hurt that people hurt people."

BUT IN LESS THAN 24 HOURS. ONE JUVENILE TURNED HIMSELF AND HIS ACCOMPLICE IN TO THE ARCATA POLICE DEPARTMENT

"These are just some of the fireworks recovered by the Arcata police department totaling over 6,000."

HOWEVER SINCE THE SUSPECTS ARE UNDERAGE, THEIR PUNISHMENT IS REDUCED..

"Technically it's still burglary it's a felony however they'll probably be dealing with juvenile probation department and a lot of this probably I would assume be dealt with outside of court in trying to reimburse the company for their loss of fireworks."

"You would hope whatever consequences they receive better than rather than start them on a worse path"

The ADA, Americans with Disabilities Act, in 2011, defined service animals as a dog only, so if somebody says they have a service monkey, a service cat, or a service snake, ADA only defines it as dogs.

It's the Tsurai Village and it's time for us to take the next step of making arrangements for that land to go back to the Tsurai,"

"Representation of the Tsurai Ancestral Society says they have mixed feelings about the settlement," "We're glad that something finally has happened but we think this should of happened, this commitment to protect the property was made many,

many, many years ago and should have been honored at that time,"

ANOTHER LAWSUIT WAS FILED AGAINST A DIFFERENT PROPERTY OWNER FOR CUTTING VEGETATION IN THIS AREA IN 20-12... BUT THAT CASE WILL BE DISMISSED IF THE CITY OF TRINIDAD FOLLOWS THE CONDITIONS PUT FORWARD.

"It's going to be a challenge in the future to protect the land. We're going to have to rely on peoples' integrity and trust and respect for this land,"

I think everybody should do more to be respectful and understand that actions like cutting on a sacred site has repercussions,"

"I have a heart. But also care about my neighbors and I care about my community. I care that the midnight shoppers. Come between, I call them the midnight stop and shoppers who prey on our community between midnight and 4 and take anything they want thats not nailed down"

"The city says over the past nine weeks of clean ups. Over 134 thousand pounds trash has been collected, plus more then 300 hypodermic needles, 250 shopping carts and 150 tires. Now when I spoke with people who live in the marsh here there defense is. Not all the the blight is from them- they say outside sources are come in and illegally dump large items, including the tires"

"i've worked with tires some of the toes they showed were semi tires those are 90 to 110 pounds a piece. People aren't going tk carry those. Those are brought there and dumped. "

Council also addressed its open pace property management plan. Which is a plan to develop the city's waterfront property into recreational use. When it was all said and done. Council voted to table both items..

"We don't have an exit plan, I heard a lot of public comment about people not wanting these folks in their neighborhoods. So until we out that in place we've tables it until january. Then we'll return look at it again.

WITH A CONSENSUS ON THE NEED OF MORE HOUSING, A SHELTER AND/ OR AN OFFICIAL CAMPGROUND SOMEWHERE THE HOMELESS COULD LIVE.

vital to our economy. We don't have a lot of commercial establishments here. "

LOGGER BAR GO-ERS SAY, IT COULDN'T REMAIN OPEN IF THE LIVE MUSIC WAS GONE. A MAN WHO LIVES NEAR THE BAR AND FILED A COMPLAINT SPOKE FIRST AT THE CITY COUNCIL MEETING.

"There have been a few incidences where a band refused to cooperate, was obviously over the top. Was asked to stop and then they're never invited back. So there is an obvious concern from the part of ownership to be considerate do the surroundings. "

ONE QUESTION ASKED, IS THE BAR REQUIRED TO FOLLOW THE CURRENT NOISE ORDINANCE, WHICH STATES SOUNDS MUST BE BELOW A CERTAIN LEVEL BY 10 P.M. BLUE LAKE'S MAYOR STATED. ANY ESTABLISHMENT THAT WAS OPERATING PRIOR TO THE ORDINANCE IS EXEMPT.

"Another complaint states that people leave the bar, they argue and fight in the street and damage property. However people that attend the bar say the bartenders are highly skilled and have zero tolerance for

fighting."

"The bartenders will make you call a cab. They'll take your keys and call you a cab. They'll even drive you home themselves I've seen bunny and other people drive people home themselves if they don't have money for a cab. It's not that kind of place, we take care of our own here."

"I don't ever remember a fight in here and I've lived here a long time. People come here as a community."
