16<sup>TH</sup>...WHEN OFFICERS WERE SEARCHING FOR  
A FELONY WARRANT SUSPECT ON ALLARD  
AVENUE. CHIEF MILLS SAYS WHEN THEY  
SAW A CONFRONTATION BETWEEN THOMAS  
MCCLAIN AND ANOTHER MAN, THEY SAW  
MCCLAIN DO WHAT IS CALLED A "SAFETY  
CHECK."

"You'll see people pat with their  
wrist, or take their thumb and put it  
over the weapon to make sure that  
it's there. The officers noticed  
this. At that point, the weapon was  
not seen, however,"

CHIEF MILLS SAYS OFFICERS THEN CALLED  
IN THE SERGEANT OF THEIR OPERATIONS.

"Sgt. Stephens directed the officers  
to stay in place but to have the  
roving officer drive by the  
aggressor's location in an attempt to  
force the man with the gun back in  
the house,"

BUT THEN, CHIEF MILLS SAID OFFICERS  
SAW THE GUN ON MCCLAIN FOR THE FIRST  
TIME.

"Tommy mcclain pulled it out of his pants when the police officer drove by, cycled it, and then put it back in his pants. There is no doubt in their mind that they a, saw the weapon, and b, heard the cycle of the slide, raising the level of threat at this time,"

CHIEF MILLS SAYS SGT. STEPHENS GOT OUT OF HIS CAR AND GAVE MCCLAIN COMMANDS...AND OFFICER STEPHEN LINFOOT CAME TO THE FRONT OF THE HOUSE TO ASSIST...AFTER BEING PARKED IN THE ALLEY BEHIND THE HOME.

"As observed by three officers for an unknown reason, tommy mcclain dropped his hands and grabbed the gun.

Linfoot, who was twelve feet away, had site alignment on his torso and fired; striking mcclain,"

POLICE CONFIRM OFFICER STEPHEN LINFOOT SHOT MCCLAIN 3 TIMES...AND HE WAS THE ONLY OFFICER TO FIRE A WEAPON. AT THE PRESS CONFERENCE, CHIEF MILLS SHOWED A PICTURE OF THE

B-B GUN THAT WAS FOUND ON MCCLAIN'S BODY. OFFICIALS ALSO POINTED TO EVIDENCE THEY SAY PROVES TOMMY MCCLAIN DID NOT HAVE HIS HANDS UP WHEN HE WAS SHOT.

"The bullet entry point is through the outside of the bicep, going through the bicep into the chest cavity. So you have a through and through wound and then an entrance wound to the chest cavity, that matches, as far as spacially, perfectly. So your hand can't be up like this,"

"Their main job is supervision.

Unfortunately, in some areas we go, you can't see every single inmate.

And the fact of the matter is, if you have ten inmates and one of them runs away, those officers are trained to call EPD and report it, because he can't leave his other 7 or eight inmates,"

the system is run autonomously and about every four minutes the cameras will make a full 360 degree rotation, they take photos at 45 degree angles, they take four different photos and they compare those for motion.

IF THE SYSTEM SEES SOMETHING THAT LOOKS LIKE SMOKE, IT'S REPORTED BACK TO THE COMMAND CENTER TO BEGIN AN EARLY RESPONSE...

after a significant drought season this year, calfire says if we do end up having another dry winter, we will have more severe wildfires and this system will help them detect those, and stop them before spreading.

THE 270 THOUSAND DOLLAR SYSTEM COMES FREE WITH A GRANT FROM PG&E. THE UTILITY COMPANY IS DISHING OUT NEARLY 2 MILLION DOLLARS FOR SIMILAR CAMERAS ACROSS THE STATE.

Fire season is a busy time for PG&E as well, because we want to protect our electric lines so that our customers don't lose power during a major fire. what we're hoping is that with the drought season that we're facing, we can be good partners in the community by helping ensure that the fire departments can detect fires early on.

AND WITH THE HELP OF THESE CAMERAS, CALFIRE SAYS THEY WILL BE AHEAD OF THE GAME FOR NEXT FIRE SEASON.

Some of our fires go 30-45 minutes without being detected and all that time is time that that fire is getting bigger. so the faster we can get resources on the fire, the smaller we can keep them and that protects homes, lives, property.

Knight: a lot of the public is fearful of being a victim of a crime so many members of the public do purchase firearms and as long as their trained and the appropriately store it, that's not a problem.

BUT PROPER TRAINING AND STORAGE IS NOT ALWAYS THE CASE WITH GUN OWNERS. LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS HAVE SEEN ENOUGH SITUATIONS OF INAPPROPRIATE OR UNINFORMED OWNERSHIP.

Knight: We've had many cases throughout the United States and in California where children have been killed by taking up a firearm and playing with it. Including some law enforcement officers that have left their firearm unattended.

Mills: Statistically, if you look at all the injuries that come to people in homes, people who have firearms are more likely to use it on themselves than they are other people.

BUT THAT DOESN'T MAKE OWNING A GUN WRONG. FOR OUR POLICE AND POLITICIANS, IT STRESSES THE IMPORTANCES OF REGULATION.

Huffman: It's not about taking anyone's guns away or guns for self-defense...taking those away. It's about getting a serious rigorous registration system and background system in place so we can better protect our kids and our communities. AND EVEN IF GUNS WERE REMOVED, SOME SAY TAKING THEM WOULD NOT SOLVE THE MUCH DEEPER, UNDERLYING ISSUE.

KEVIN: I think violence is in human nature. There's good and there's evil and there's always going to people who are willing to commit bad acts

"Some people would prefer camping out. Some people who come, they come just to eat and they have tents and places that they go,"

"I stay outdoors and i feel sufficient enough. And sometimes when it gets cold, they need more space for people who aren't as well geared up, so i feel i don't need to be indoors when i'm well okay outside,"

OTHERS HAVE DIFFERENT REASONS FOR NOT WANTING TO STAY AT THE EUREKA RESCUE MISSION.

"I'm a light sleeper. So if i hear any noise, i'm just going to be up all night, and if you're up all night, you're not getting any rest, so it's like, what's the point of being there?,"

THE EUREKA RESCUE MISSION CAN HOUSE 65 MEN AND 35 WOMEN AND CHILDREN.

THE EXTREME WEATHER SHELTER CAN HOLD ABOUT 30 MEN.

"All they have to do is behave themselves and conduct themselves in a proper way. The rules aren't really strict here. You come in and don't bother anybody around them and eat their food in peace and take a nice, hot shower and go to bed,"
